The Papermakers Walloped For 10 Runs and 15 Hits

PLAYERS AND FANS BECAME HEATED UP ON THE DECISIONS ON BALLS AND STRIKES BY HIS NIBS THE UMP. BEHIND THE PLATE ON FRIDAY. TATE ALLOWED BUT 3 HITS.

Timmins again jumped into the lead of the N.O.B.A. when they trounced the Papermakers on Friday last on the Miners' home lot, to the tune of 10 to 5, and made them like it.

The Miners started out as if they intended to present the game to the Pulpeaters in the early part of the game and did nearly everything in their power towards that end, Tate's inability to locate the plate did not help matters. The umpire's work behind the plate was anything but good and had the players on each side very much against him and the fans were rather disgusted with his work.

Monaghan came through with two glaring errors in the initial frame which paved the way for the Falls' 1st tally, and the two old reliables, McIntyre and Scully took the opportunity to unload a little bad baseball from their systems, when they also came through with an error a piece which added two more gift runs for the Papermakers.

The Miners were also made a gift of two runs on errors by Graham and Flanders in the initial frame.

Tate's wildness in the 4th frame got him into a heap of trouble when he walked Flanders and fumbled Hurlbert's bunt, and then hit Bart. His own good fielding then got him out of a bad hole, when the Papermakers attempted squeeze-play ended up in two men being forced at home and only one run being developed and that on McDonald's single to left. The 3rd out was also made at the plate on McLean's perfect throw home which easily got Graham trying to score from second.

Although Tate allowed but 3 hits, his wildness got him into trouble continually and he walked no less than 7 men, and hit two and uncocked a wild pitch which resulted in a run. He also was the cause of upsetting the dope for Hurlbert on two occasions. With one on and two out in the 5th frame he was intentionally passed and Pierce came through with a single which scored a run.

Tate started the fire works in the 7th and crossed Hurlbert up when with the count 3 and 0 on him he slammed the 4th ball pitched to the fence for a double.

McIntyre galloped off with the batting honors of the day by grabbing 4 hits out of 5 times up. Lynch playing 3rd came through with a very nice game and hit at a 500 clip. McLean's playing in the left garden and Lewis in the right got away with the fielding features of the day, and Pierce at 1st and Murphy at 2nd disappointed themselves in fine style.

Johnny Spence at 1st for the Papermakers played the initial corner in great style, and saved his team mates errors on two occasions. He by no means weakens the Falls lineup, while Cunningham and McDonald are two very nice ball players with very good throwing arms. But the Papermakers' management showed poor strategy in the 4th in attempting the squeeze-play with none out.

The umpiring on the bases was very satisfactory to both clubs, but not so with the man behind the plate.

1st Innings

Falls—Lewis had to go back to the fence to get Bart's high lift. Graham struck his elbow into the ball and got a free passage to 1st for his pains. Cunningham safe on Monaghan's wild throw. McDonald forced Cunningham at 2nd, Lynch to Murphy. Bousquet safe on 1st and Graham scored on Monaghan's bad throw. Bousquet died stealing. 1 R., 0 H., 2 E.

Timmins—Lynch lifted to McDonald. Scully singled and stole 2nd. McLean fouled to Graham. Tate safe on 1st on Flanders error. Scully taking 3rd. Tate stole 2nd and took 3rd and Scully scored when Graham threw the ball into centre field. Pierce singled to right scoring Tate. Murphy grounded out to Spence. 2 R., 2 H., 2 E.

Falls—Flanders walked. Hurlbert's sacrifice brought him safely to 1st when Tate fumbled it. Bart was hit by pitched ball, filling the bags, on an attempted squeeze-play. Flanders was forced at home, Tate to McIntyre. Another squeeze play went wrong when Hurlbert was forced at home the same way. McDonald singled sharply to left, scoring Bart, and Graham was nabbed at the plate on McLean's perfect throw in. 1 R., 1 H., 1 E.

Timmins—Pierce flied to Bousquet. Murphy bounced a hit off Spence's glove. Murphy was caught at 2nd. McIntyre and Monaghan singled past 3rd. Lewis fanned. 0 R., 2 H., 0 E.

5th Innings

Falls—Bousquet was thrown out by Tate. Chirooski flied out to Scully. Spence tapped to Tate. 0 R., 0 H., 0 E.

Timmins—Lynch singled past 2nd and was out stealing. Scully lifted to Chirooski. McLean doubled. Tate was passed intentionally. Pierce looped a single over 3rd, scoring Tate. Murphy walked. McIntyre fanned. 1 R., 3 H., 0 E.

6th Innings

Falls—McLean went over to the right field foul line to get Flanders' fly. Hurlbert also flied out to McLean. Bart out, Murphy to Pierce. 0 R., 0 H., 0 E.

Timmins—Monaghan walked. Lewis bunted into Hurlbert's mitt. Lynch walked. Scully flied to Flanders and McLean to McDonald. 0 R., 0 H., 0 E.

7th Innings

Falls—Graham walked and was doubled off 1st when Cunningham bunted into Tate's hand. McDonald safe on 1st on Monaghan's high throw. Bousquet grounded out to Pierce. 0 R., 0 H., 1 E.

Timmins—Tate doubled to the right field fence. Pierce hit to Hurlbert, who threw too late to get Tate at 3rd. Pierce went to 2nd unmolested. Murphy struck out. McIntyre scratched a hit to 3rd, scoring Tate. McIntyre went to 3rd and Pierce scored when Graham threw the ball into centre. Monaghan singled, scoring McIntyre. Lewis out, Flanders to Spence, Monaghan taking 2nd on

the out. Lynch singled through 2nd and continued home ahead of Monaghan when Bart let his drive roll almost to the fence. Scully out, McDonald to Spence, Spence saving McDonald an error. 5 R., 4 H., 1 E.
