MOST WONDERFUL QUARTZ GOLD MINE IN THE WORLD

Writer in London "Statist" So Reports of the Hollinger Gold Mine at Timmins.

Many references have recently been made to an article in The Statist, a leading financial journal in London, England, in regard to the methods used in financing mining properties in Ontario. Not as much publicity has been given articles by The Statist on leading mines of Canada. In a recent issue The Statist had an interesting and informative article on the Hollinger Mine. The Statist said:—

"It is no exaggeration to say that the Hollinger is the most wonderful quartz gold mine ever developed. As yet, from the point of view of production, it does not rank first, but there is every likelihood that it will do so in the course of the next year or so. Judged by area, the mine is not to be compared with the giants of the Witwatersrand, for the property altogether covers only 600 acres, and so far the gold produced and in developed ore reserves has been found in little more than 100 acres. The concentration of gold is extraordinary. To date the output has reached £14,000,000, the ore reserves contain an equal quantity of the metal in three score veins, and there appears to be no evidence yet of diminution of value or persistency in depth.

"Mr. A. F. Brigham, the general manager—formerly associated with the management of De Beers Diamond Mine—has brought the organization to a pitch of efficiency comparable to that of any great industrial enterprise and the market price of the company's shares, affording a yield at present dividends of only about 5½ per cent., denotes the appreciation of shareholders. Last year shortage of hydro electric power (the company's present consumption of which is about 12,000 h.p.) was responsible for the reduced production, and this, combined with the effect of lower grade ore and increased costs caused the working profit to decline by nearly \$2,000,000. Nevertheless, the total profit of \$4,374,485 was considerably more than the sum of \$3,198,000 required to maintain the dividend at the rate of 13 per cent. recorded for the previous two years.

"The decline in the gold yield per ton for the third consecutive year does not imply reduction in the average value of the ore opened up in the period, but rather reflects the management's policy (frankly admitted) of securing profits from the high premium on gold which existed in 1920-1921 by selling some of the richest ore in the mine. Similarly shareholders have been warned not to regard even \$8 as an average expectation of ore per ton yield for the future, for the reason that a big expansion program is being pursued, and, indeed, the doubling of the mill capacity to 8,000 tons per day, which is the immediate aim, is well advanced so far as the main items of the additional equipment are concerned.

Even if the average grade of ore treated is reduced to \$7, the output of gold will be the largest of any mine in the world. Costs should be reduced to \$4—indeed quite conceivably less—in which case the profits will rise to \$7,000,000. This would cover an increase in the annual dividend of 15 per cent. per annum with a margin of over \$2,000,000. Possibly the dividend rate may be raised by 17 per cent. per annum but it is as well to remember that the policy is to justify the shareholders' regard for the shares as an investment with the speculative element reduced to a minimum."

The Haileyburian last week says: "John Lavallee, of Golden Lake, employed as a guide in the Temagami district, died on Saturday last in camp at Lady Evelyn Lake following a debauch on bootleg whiskey procured it is said, in North Bay during the week. Coroner Dr. McMurehy, of North Bay, held an inquest at Temagami on Monday and a verdict of death from alcoholic poisoning was the result. Lavallee had spent part of the week in North Bay, where he was hired on Friday by Wm. C. Awfer, of South Porcupine, to go on a prospecting trip. While in camp on Saturday evening he complained of being sick and gradually grew worse until he died about five o'clock. The body was interred at Temagami and the provincial police are endeavouring to ascertain the names of the parties who sold the liquor."
