Papermakers Shut Out the Miners, 3 to 0, on Wednesday

TIMMINS TEAM LOSES AGAIN, DROPPING BACK TO SECOND PLACE IN THE LEAGUE RACE. THEY MUST WIN THIS (WEDNESDAY) AFTERNOON TO TIE UP THE N.O.B.A.

Although Hurlbert pitched an exceptionally fine game for the Papermakers, Dunc. McLean came through with an equally as good a performance, but was forced to take defeat because the heavy-hitting Miners fell down badly in the pinches.

Timmins had wonderful chances to score in the 1st and 8th innings when with two on and none out, McLean and Tate failed to come through safely, and Scully and Pierce struck out with the bases loaded and none out in the 8th.

The Papermakers scored their 1st run in the 4th when Graham was hit and Cunningham doubled, then followed two more runs which were given to them as a gift through some loose playing by McIntyre and Lynch. The Falls 4th run which was scored in the 6th, was also a gift through Monaghan's wild peg and Coon's double.

McLean allowed but 3 hits and struck out 6 batsmen while he walked two and hit one, while seven hits were garnered off Lefty Hurlbert's delivery, two of them being doubles. He struck out 11 men and walked only one.

Scully made a beautiful running catch of Graham's fly which drew the applause of the fans, and Harry Plaunt who was calling them on the bases was mixing them up by calling them good and others not so good, but he showed no partiality and both clubs lost and gained from his work, but no damage was done.

Murphy fielded in splendid style but like the rest of his teammates he failed to connect safely when hits meant runs.

However the close race in the American league hasn't got a thing on Mr. Magurn's circuit.

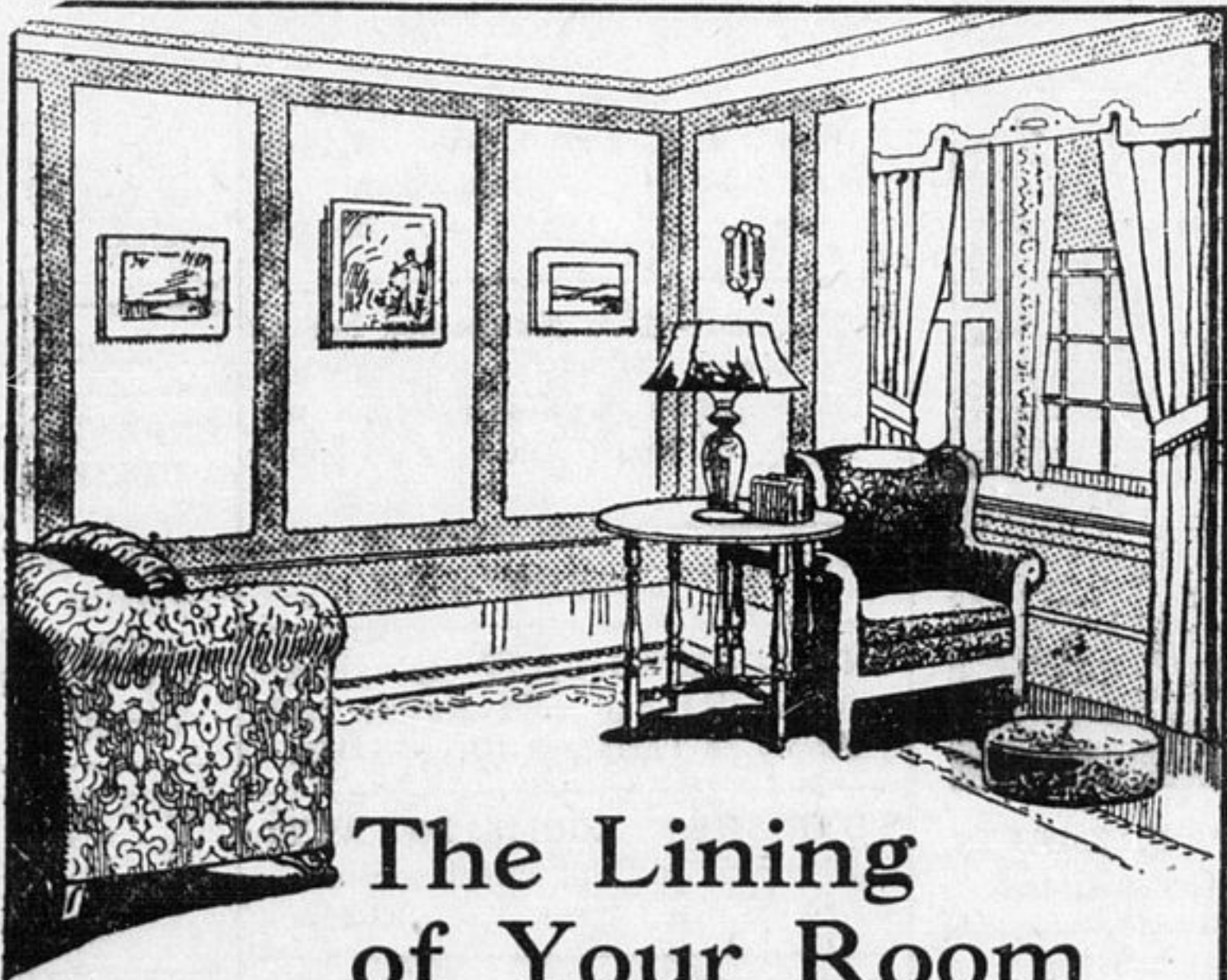
