RESOURCES OF THE NORTH SHOWN AT OTTAWA FAIR

Striking Mineral Display and Interesting Agricultural Exhibits Suggest Great Possibilities of the North Lana.

Last Week The Advance published an article referring to the North Land exhibit at the National Fair at Toronto. Below is a reference to the showing made at the Central Canada Exhibition at Ottawa.

"Seldom have the splendid agricultural and mineral resources of vast Northern Ontario been more strikingly impressed on visitors to the Central Canada Exhibition, than by this year's exhibits at the grounds arranged by the Department of Colonization and Immigration of the Ontario Government, through the co-operation of Hon. John S. Martin, Minister of Agriculture, in the Ontario Cabinet, and supervised by Mr. H. A. Macdonell, director of colonization.

"Every possible variety of farm and garden produce grown in that land of widely diversified possibilities is on display in the building. Here is also shown a most comprehensive array of specimens of valuable metals and ores, made up by the Ontario Department of Mines. Colored and illuminated scenes taken from different populous centres of the north and also from the vast unpopulated spaces abounding with game and other wild life are also displayed conspicuously.

"All of the garden produce shown are remarkable for their perfect quality and size, and (particularly in the case of several varieties of potatoes) for almost unbelievable size and conformity, and freedom from blemish. Practically all vegetables can be grown on the farms of Ontario's northland, it would be hard to believe that they could be improved upon.

"Printed statistics call attention to the fact that Northern Ontario covers an area of 330,000 square miles, 121,000 miles larger than Great Britain. There are 20,000,000 acres of agricultural land, much of it in the Great Clay Belt where the land for agricultural purposes is stated to be the best in the world.

"The mineral display is particularly comprehensive, even the most remote and obscure type being present in some form or other. Gold ore from the Hollinger, Dome and other prominent mines make up a large and most impressive exhibit, while copper, nickel, iron, graphite, silver, etc., in crude and refined state occupies a prominent place.

"Taken all in all, the whole exhibit tells a story of immense agricultural, mineral, forest wealth, and explains conclusively why in many quarters Northern Ontario is regarded as a veritable land of promise."

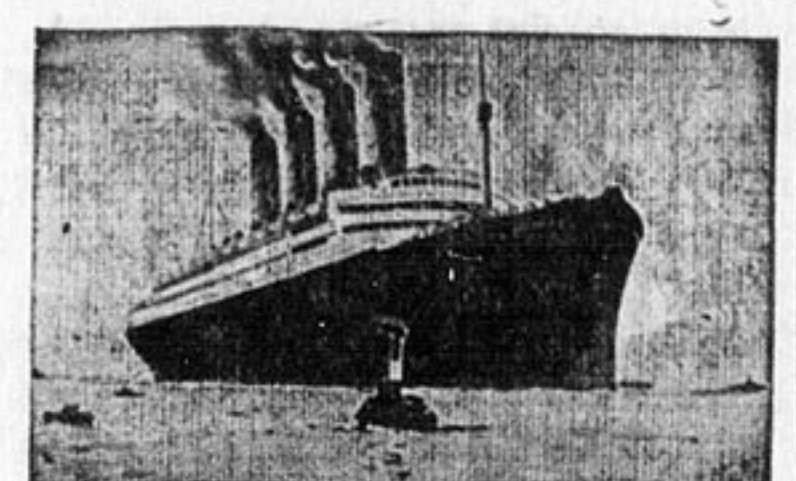
DATES OF FALL FAIRS IN NORTH LAND THIS YEAR
