ONTARIO MINING COURT
NOW FULLY ESTABLISHED

Mr. T. E. Godson, K.C., Formally Raised to Status of Judge. Court Can Now Deal With Patented as Well as Unpatented Lands.

Announcement was made last week that the Dominion Government had concurred in the Ontario Government's appointment of a Judge of the Ontario Mining Court to deal with all mining disputes. Mining Commissioner T. E. Godson, K.C., has accordingly been elevated to bench rank and given much wider powers. While the Dominion Government has made the appointment the Ontario Government will pay the salary.

In dealing with mining disputes and difficulties of all kinds, the Ontario Mining Commissioner proved unusually successful. His court (if it may be called such) was noted for the fairness of its decisions and justice was always arrived at with economy and without red tape for those seeking its services. In its sphere its usefulness was great indeed, and Commissioner Godson secured the confidence of all. Only unpatented lands, however, came under his jurisdiction, and there grew up an agitation to have the Commissioner's jurisdiction extended to patented mining claims. It was pointed out that Mr. Godson's special knowledge and experience in mining matters made this particularly desirable. The Mining Association, the press and leading public men joined in the demand for the extended jurisdiction. It was pointed out that to legally extend the jurisdiction the creation of a mining court would be required. "All right," was the common verdict, "let a mining court be created."

Following this idea along, at the last session of the Legislature the Ontario Government presented and secured approval for a bill entitled, "An Act to Create the Mining Court of Ontario," which contained a provision to make the Mining Commissioner a judge.

Some months ago word came from Ottawa to the effect that there was a hitch in the proceedings, Ottawa authorities not being ready to make the necessary judgements without further consideration. Again, the press and the public took up the matter, urging upon the Dominion authorities the necessity for prompt and proper action. At last this proper action seems to have eventually resulted in the elevation of Mr. Godson to the bench. He is now Judge Godson. In referring to the matter, the Ottawa Journal last week said:—

"Ottawa is officially making the appointment while Ontario, to retain jurisdiction in the matter, is paying the salary. Ottawa is accepting no responsibility in the new step that is being taken to facilitate the adjudication of mining disputes. The new mining judge will have powers to deal with all matters as outlined in the Mining Act. Various mining disputes are already pending with which the new judge of the Mining Court will have to deal. Judge Godson has dealt with mining disputes in Northern Ontario during the past 10 years, and in the North Country is conceded to be thoroughly conversant with mining matters and a high authority on matters pertaining to the Mining Act."

DEATH OF MISS BEATRICE TAYLOR AT HAMILTON, ONT.

The following paragraph from the last issue of The New Liskeard Speaker will be read with much regretful interest by many in Timmins. The Miss Taylor referred to was a sister of Mr. P. S. Taylor, for many years a resident there and prominent in the fire brigade and other circles in town. The late Miss Taylor visited Timmins on several occasions and made many friends here. The New Liskeard Speaker, says:—"On Saturday last Mrs. F. E. Thompson received a telegram an-

nouncing the death of Miss Beatrice Taylor, a former New Liskeard citizen, and daughter of Mr. T. S. Taylor, which sad event had taken place at Hamilton on the preceding day. Some time ago Miss Taylor was in an automobile accident near Hamilton and had never recovered from the injuries received at that time, her death therefore cause no surprise to the many friends of the family. The young lady was a general favorite amongst her large circle of friends and her long illness has been a source of sorrow to all. The deep sympathy of all goes to the bereaved family in the loss of one whose life, up to a short time ago, gave great promise."
