FATAL ACCIDENT AT THE VIPOND ON SATURDAY

Mr. J. H. Millbury Meets Accidental Death While at Work in Mine.

Mr. J. H. Millbury, a miner at the Vipond Mine, died on Saturday following injuries received while at work. He and his partner were engaged at work on a contract at the 400-ft. level. They had drilled the top holes, and at noon Mr. Millbury told his partner to have his lunch and he would continue the drilling. While the partner was away the accident occurred. It is not known definitely just what occurred but it is thought that Mr. Millbury drilled into a missed hole. He was terribly injured by the explosion, his face and head being particularly injured. Despite prompt attention and all possible care he passed away a short time after the accident.

The late Mr. Millbury had been here for over a year and a half. He had many friends and was held in the highest regard by all and his death is very deeply regretted by wide circles of friends and acquaintances. He was a native of Nova Scotia and was 32 years of age. A widow and two children survive. To these and to the other near relatives and friends very sincere sympathy is extended at this sad time.
