**CALEDONIAN TO OBSERVE HALLOWE'EN ON OCT. 24**

Regular Meeting in I.O.O.F. Hall Will be Hallowe'en Night. All Should Come in Costume.

A jolly observance is promised of Hallowe'en this year again by the Caledonian Society of Timmins. In former years this night has been a happy one for young and old. The arrangements are being looked after by the Executive and the Ladies' Committee of the Society, the latter taking up the greater part of the work. From past experience it may be taken for granted that the night will be a fine one, for the ladies never fail on any occasion.

The Society will observe Hallowe'en on the regular meeting night of the Society, Oct. 24th.—Friday of this week. The event will be held in the I.O.O.F. Hall. The Executive has taken up the question of securing a larger hall, but in the meantime until definite arrangements can be made the I.O.O.F. Hall will be continued in use. **FUNERAL AT COBALT OF THE LATE J. H. MILLBURY**

The following is from last week's issue of The Northern News, Cobalt: "A large number of relatives, friends and former neighbors paid their last respects to the late Mr. John Harland Millbury, victim of a fatal accident of the Vipond Mine, Porcupine, last Saturday, and whose funeral was held from the home of his sister, Mrs. E. H. Clemens, Coniagas Mine, on Tuesday afternoon.

The Rev. E. F. Pinnington, rector of St. James' Anglican church, officiated at the services in the house and at the graveside in Silverland cemetery. The pall-bearers were: Messrs. John Conroy, Willie Keizer, Elmer Keizer, Huntley Gillan, Angus Morrison and Patrick McDonald. Many beautiful floral tributes were sent to the memory of the deceased gentleman, including tokens from Mr. and Mrs. R. E. Dye, of the Vipond; Timmins L.O.L. 2532, People's Provision Store, Boys of the O'Connor House, Schumacher, Mr. and Mrs. S. A. McDonald, Mr. and Mrs. F. D. Reid, Mr. and Mrs. E. B. Whorley, W.A. of St. James' church, Silver Rebekah Lodge No. 107, Miss H. Boyle and Miss M. Campbell, Wilfred Millbury, Mr. and Mrs. George Bullen, Mr. and Mrs. C. Scammel, Mr. and Mrs. Bryant, Mr. and Mrs. E. P. Barkell and Mr. and Mrs. E. H. Clemens.

The late Mr. Millbury was well-known in this camp, having been employed at different mines in Cobalt in the earlier years. During the war he served with H.C.M.S. Niobe and he returned to Northern Ontario

about two years ago, going to Porcupine. On Saturday morning, about 11.30 while operating a machine, he drilled into a missed hole and was so terribly injured that he died about five o'clock in the afternoon. Word of the accident was sent here, and Mr. and Mrs. Clemens left Saturday afternoon for Porcupine. Mr. Wilfred Millbury, a brother, who was in Gowganda, motored through to Cobalt in the early hours of Sunday and went north the same afternoon.

"The deceased gentleman was 34 years of age and was a native of Wine Harbor, Guysboro County, Nova Scotia. Surviving are his wife and three young children, also three brothers and five sisters."

Mr. J. A. MacArthur has been again appointed Collector of Taxes for the Town of Haileybury.
