**AND TIMMINS DID UNCORK A FEW SURPRISES FOR TORONTO**

Saturday's issue of The Toronto Globe had the following reference to the Timmins Football Team then in the city to play in the Ontario Cup series. Suffice it to say, that "Timmins did uncork a few surprises for Toronto," and the optimism of Secretary Field seems well justified. The Globe article is as follows:—

Timmins, the Northern Ontario soccer champions, arrived in the city yesterday to compete in the Ontario Cup with Mimico. The team is under the care of W. A. Field, the well-known soccer enthusiast of the North. He is very optimistic about his team, and promises to uncork a few surprises for Toronto fans. A feature of the line-up, showing the versatility of the mining district, is the fact that no less than four Norwegians are on the forward line. The centre forward, Peterson, is an outstanding player. The defence is somewhat weakened by the absence of the right full-back, who could not make the trip. The position is being filled by Liddle. The team defeated Kirkland Lake after a three-game struggle by the "orphan goal," and later defeated North Bay by 5 goals to 1. W. A. Field had the team out for practice for an hour or so up at Ossington Athletic Grounds yesterday afternoon, and he reports that everything is in readiness for today. Notwithstanding the long journey, the team looks very fit.

Manager J. Lowe of Mimico is not broadcasting. The team he intends fielding will, in all probability, be the same that defeated Mimico Beach a week ago.

**NEW LISKEARD ADDS MOTOR TRUCK TO FIRE EQUIPMENT.**

New Liskeard has been buying a little "good luck" in the matter of fire protection. The "luck" of Timmins in the matter of fires has been proverbial in this North Land. Other towns in the North have been badly damaged by fire at various times, but Timmins has so far been "lucky" in this respect. There have been fires here, but no fire has been allowed to get away. No fire has travelled farther than the building in which it originated. This sort of "luck," of course, has been bought and paid for in years past. There may be a slight tendency to neglect to foster "luck" in fires here at the present moment but no doubt this tendency will pass and the old thoughtful plan of buying "luck" by securing the best possible equipment regardless of cost, and having the most effective fire-fighting organization will be reverted to, and the "luck" of the town thus continue. It costs money to have "luck" in fires in a town, but it is worth it. New Liskeard will no doubt find it will get as much "luck" in this respect as may be purchased by money and attention. The New Liskeard Speaker last week says:—

"The Council acceded to the request of the local firemen, and have had placed in the fire hall, a motor truck which carries 1,000 feet of fire hose, and is equipped with a forty gallon chemical tank and 200 feet of chemical hose. This addition to our other fire fighting equipment, our efforts to dispose of inflammable refuse around the town, and our rigid inspection of chimneys, etc., ought to be very helpful in the prevention of loss by fire. The team and hose wagon will still be used in emergency cases, and will be kept in the same fit condition all the time, night and day. Our firemen are doing good work, and should be encouraged."
