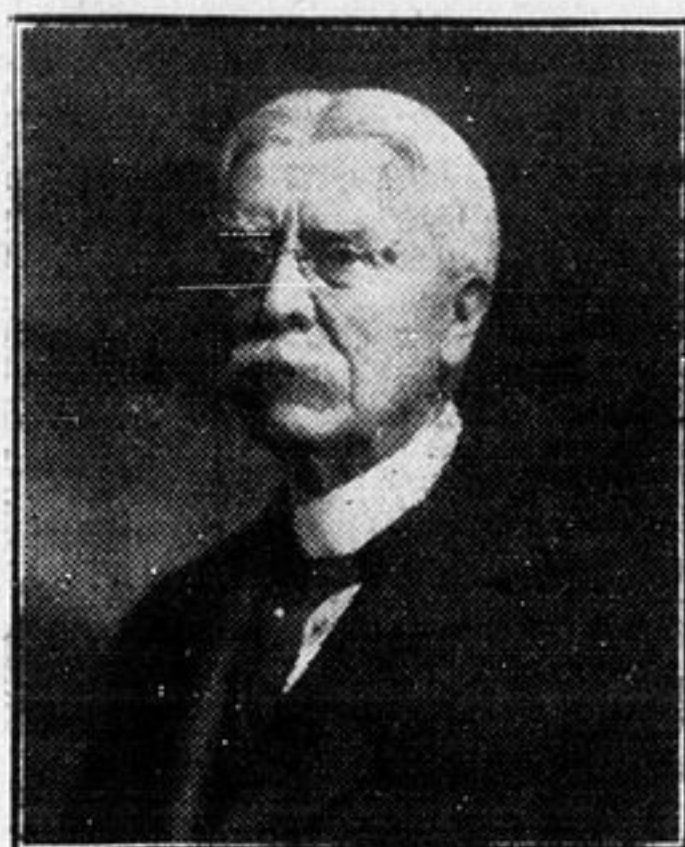

PROMINENT IN CANADA FOR OVER HALF A CENTURY

Mr. J. K. Macdonald, the Dean of Canadian Life Insurance Business, Celebrates 87th Birthday.

On October 12th, Mr. J. K. Macdonald dean of the Life Assurance Business in Canada celebrated his 87th birthday. Insurance men from Halifax to Vancouver will, no doubt experience a glow of pride in the career of the dean of their profession.

Mr. J. K. Macdonald was born in Edinburgh, Scotland, in the year Queen Victoria commenced her reign, to be exact October 12, 1837. All his life he has been blessed with a vigorous constitution, and those whose pleasure it is to meet him upon his visits to the office (which he attends almost every day) are delighted with the keen interest that he still main-



tains in them and the affairs of the Confederation Life Association. He is one of the great pioneers in the business life in Canada; and it is probably a fact that he has been engaged in business longer than any other man now active in business life in the Dominion.

The Confederation Life Association is the monument to his career. It was largely due to his foresight and sagacity that it was started in 1871 and since that time he has been practically its principal executive officer. He is an authority on Life Assurance subjects, his experience having given him a broad grasp of the subject that is possibly unexcelled.

For sixty years or more Mr. Macdonald has been prominent in the work of the Presbyterian church, and also in the work of the Aged and Infirm Ministers' Fund. Besides these, he has been active in all movements for general philanthropic purposes, and no man in Canada is better known than he in connection with work of that nature.

KIRKLAND LAKE BOY SHOT IN THE LEG BY ANOTHER BOY

The fact that boys should not have access to firearms is emphasized by a paragraph which appeared in The Northern News last week. It is from the Kirkland Lake correspondent of the Cobalt newspaper, and reads as follows:—

"Mr. Dan Dale's young son, about 14 years old, is laid up with a 22 calibre bullet wound in his leg as a result of the carelessness of another young fellow. Chief Johnston has notified a number of parents in the camp about allowing minors under 16 to prowl around the woods and highways with rifles. A couple of days ago a young hopeful was taking aim at a dog on the road, with three other youths standing right behind the dog in the line of fire. The Chief just happened along and deprived the young fellow of the rifle and possibly averted a serious accident. If parents will persist in permitting children to carry rifles without any supervision, some prosecutions are likely to follow."

LOOK AFTER YOUR VOTE FOR MUNICIPAL COUNCIL

Although You are on the Plebiscite List This Does Not Mean Anything in Regard to a Municipal Vote.

Last week reference was made to the fact that a lot of citizens were under the impression that because they had seen to the placing of their names on the lists for voting in the Plebiscite on October 23rd, they would be entitled to vote on municipal matters. The two lists are distinct and separate and have no bearing on each other. The one is for Provincial Purposes only and the other for Municipal Voting. It is true that the names added by the Judge here in connection with the Revising of the List for the Plebiscite are to be considered as part of the Municipal Voters' List, but only as Part III. of that list, headed, "Those Entitled to Vote at Elections to the Legislative Assembly Only." The addition of your name by the Revising Officer recently has accordingly no bearing on your municipal vote. That Revising Officer business was for the Ontario Elections only. Because many are still not clear on the question, The Advance would urge all citizens to see that they are duly entered on the Town of Timmins Voters' List for municipal elections.

For the revising of the Town Voters' List the usual procedure is being followed. Copies of the list are posted up as required by law. The list may be seen at any time during office hours at the Town Clerk's Office. If your name is not on the list leave the necessary application with the Clerk to have the name added. Too many citizens who think they are entitled to vote leave the matter until too late. It is no use kicking because you have no vote. Do your part and see that you have a vote.

CONIAGAS SECURES OPTION ON THREE NATIONS CLAIMS

Official confirmation was reported last week in the despatches of the report that the Coniagas Mines Company will undertake the exploration and development of the Three Nations, the La Palme and other adjoining properties in the Three Nation Lake section of Whitney Township, in the Porcupine field.

The deal is in the form of a working agreement, with an option to purchase at an attractive price should the results of work warrant such a course.
