Mr. G. S. Lowe was a visitor to Toronto for the week-end.

Miss Edna O'Brien, of Cochrane, was the guest of Mrs. A. G. Carson for the Thanksgiving holiday.

Mr. W. A. Griffin, Superintendent of the T. and N. O. Railway, and the Master Mechanic of the line, were visitors to Timmins last week.

Mr. J. L. Hunt, manager of the Dominion Bank, returned last week from London, Ont., to which city he had been called owing to the death of his sister.
