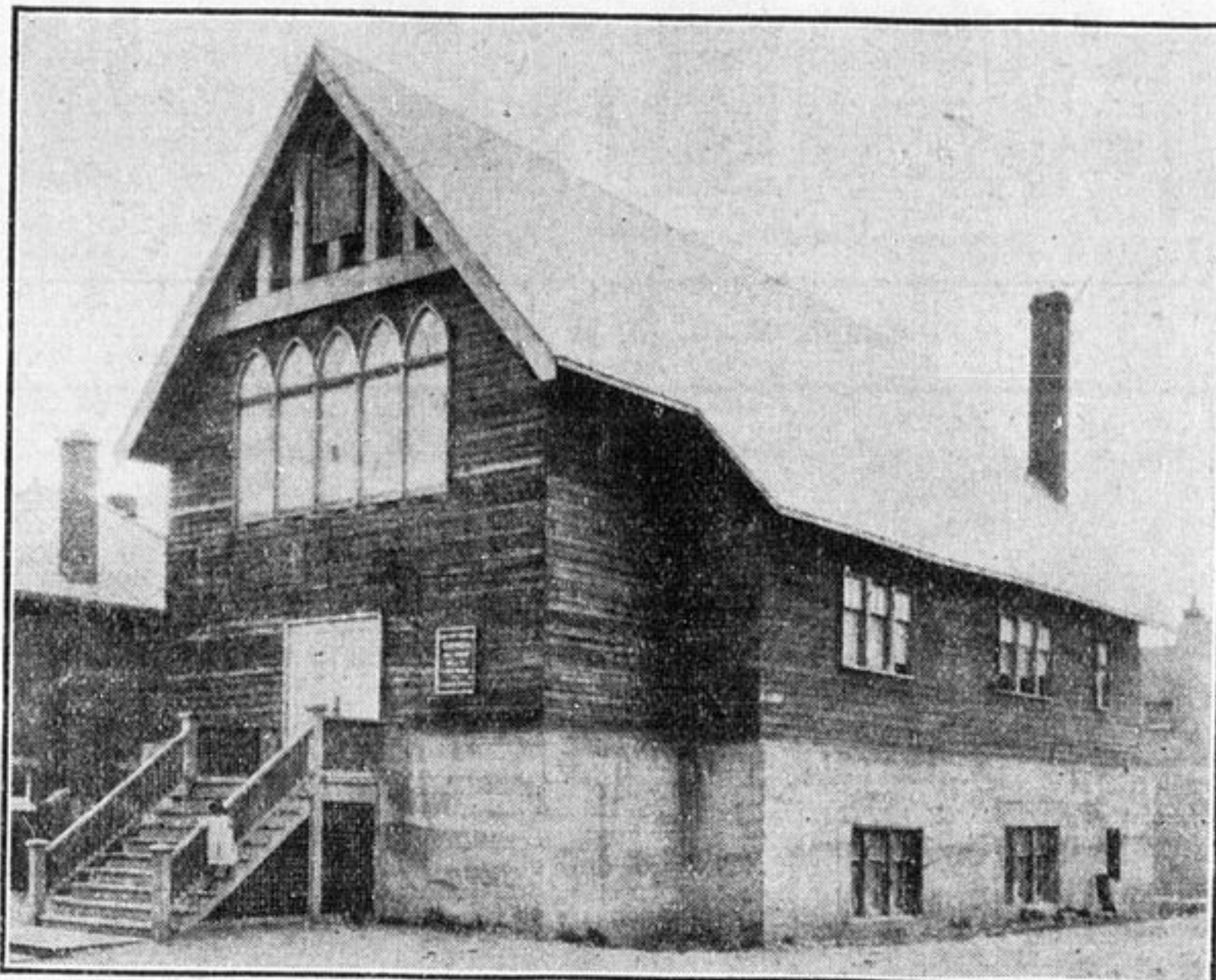

The Churches of Timmins

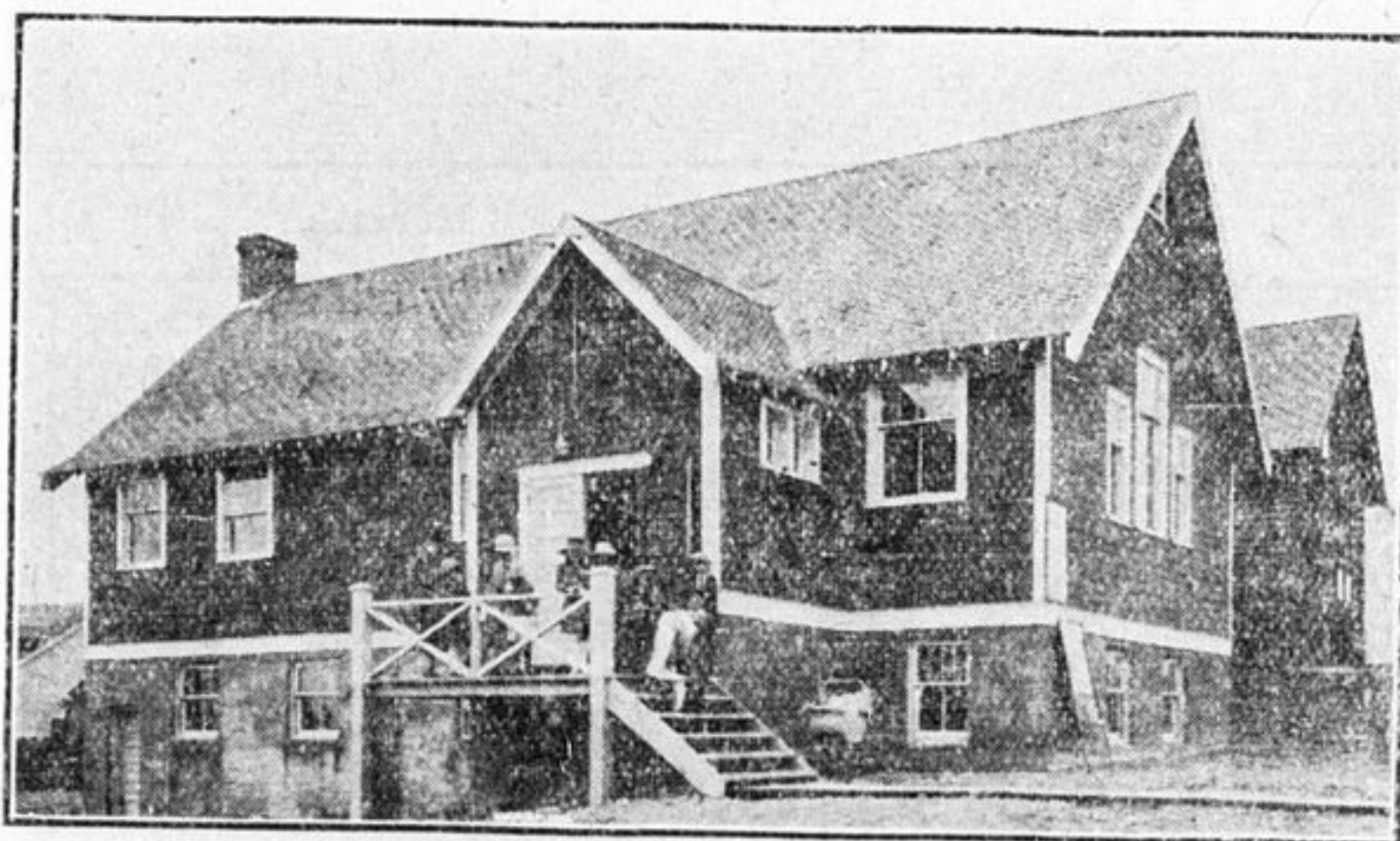
Church Board. He was placed in Timmins in 1912. Following Mr. Othan, came Mr. G. McFarlane, a Queen's University student, in 1914. He held services in what is now a store on Third Avenue. Rev. Chas. A. Malcolm, M.A., of South Porcupine, conducted services here each Sunday for a time in a building used during the week for the manufacture of soft drinks.

Later, the old public school building was used. The first church organization was the Ladies' Aid, established in January, 1915. In February of the same year the first Board of Managers was formed, Mr. Geo. Vary being chairman. In April Mr. J. Maxwell Allen took charge of the congregation. In October, the congregation was regularly organized, and plans started for a church building. The present church was formally opened in February, 1917. Rev. J. Macdonald, an able and earnest pastor, was in charge of the church from 1917 to 1918. He was succeeded by Rev. J. A. Irwin. In the latter part of 1918, Rev. J. D. Parks, B.A., B.D., came here as minister, and during the intervening years has been an earnest and energetic worker for Byrnes church, for the town, and for all other good causes. At present, Byrnes Church has under active way plans for material extension to accommodate the large congregations.

The present Baptist church on Second Avenue, near Birch street, was formally opened on Sunday, Nov. 19th, 1922, and under the pastorate of Rev. M. R. Hall, who has been in charge since that date the church has grown in strength and influence. At the present time the church building is found too small to accommodate the large congregations, and as a conse-

quence the Sunday evening services have been held for some time past in the Old Empire Theatre. Plans for an enlarged church have been under consideration.

Previous to the establishment of the present Baptist Church, the Baptists had a church organization in Timmins, the previous pastor, Rev. Ian Cruickshanks, passing away in the latter part of 1918, falling a victim to the "flu" epidemic. After the death of Rev. Mr. Cruickshanks, the Baptist Church services here were not regularly resumed until the coming of the present pastor, Rev. Mr. Hall.

THE SALVATION ARMY

Timmins also has an active and helpful corps of the Salvation Army, with large hall, opposite the public school. The Army has a Band that is growing in both members and efficiency and promises to be a noteworthy musical organization. Under Capt. and Mrs. Cornthwaite the Timmins Salvation Army is making great progress and doing much good work here.
