THE PART OF THE WORLD WHICH WILL BE AFFECTED BY A PARTIAL ECLIPSE OF THE SUN ON JANUARY 24TH.

Within the large oval is included the part of the world which will witness a partial eclipse of the sun, when the moon passes between the earth and the sun on January 24th. Most of Canada and the United States will be affected by the partial eclipse. The two small arcs which extend from north of the British Isles across the Atlantic Ocean and part way across Canada, shows the area which will be affected by a total eclipse. This particular eclipse occurs once every eighteen years and ten days, each time affecting a different part of the globe. In 220 years from January 24th, part of this territory will again be affected by this same eclipse. The eclipse begins in the State of Minnesota and ends between the Orkney Islands and the coast of Scotland.

QUARTERLY EARNINGS OF McINTYRE-PORCUPINE

Net Earnings for Six Months Total \$850,009.66, Before Plant Depreciation.

Last week the McIntyre-Porcupine Mines Limited issued an interesting statement of earnings for the first and second quarters of its fiscal year.

The official figures as given for the first quarter, ending Sept. 30th, 1924, are as follows:—Gross recovery, \$903,790.27; costs, including development, \$463,475.75; operating earnings \$440,314.52; non-operating revenue, \$20,371.35. Earnings, \$460,685.87; less provision for taxes for period, \$32,313.88; net earnings before plant depreciation, \$428,371.99.

For the second quarter, ending Dec. 31, 1924, the figures are as follows:—Gross recovery, \$885,570.90; costs, including development, \$459,079.97; operating earnings, \$426,490.93; non-operating revenue, \$24,726.31. Earnings, \$451,217.24; less provision for taxes for period, \$29,579.57; net earnings before plant depreciation, \$421,637.67.

For the six months to Dec. 31st., 1924, the figures are:—Gross recovery, \$1,789,361.17; costs, including development, \$922,555.72; operating earnings, \$866,805.45; non-operating revenue, \$45,097.66. Earnings, \$911,903.11; less provision for taxes for period, \$61,893.45; net earnings before plant depreciation, \$850,009.66.

TO BE THE GUESTS OF QUEBEC AND MONTREAL.

Representative business and professional men of Ontario have been invited to visit Quebec and Montreal as the guests of the Lieutenant-Governor of the Province of Quebec, and of the Mayors of Quebec and Montreal cities. The visit is to be a return of the hospitality extended to a party from Quebec last year. It is designed to further cement the Bon Entente between the two Provinces. The party from Ontario will leave Toronto on Jan. 28th, and will spend three days at Quebec and Montreal. The party will include the Hon. H. Cockshutt, the Lieutenant-Governor of Ontario, Premier Ferguson and other members of the Cabinet and the Legislature, as well as prominent business men and professional men from various parts of the Province. Among those in Timmings receiving invitations from the Lieutenant-Governor of Quebec and the Mayor of Montreal are: His Worship the Mayor, Dr. J. A. McInnis, President F. M. Wallingford, of the Board of Trade, Mr. T. F. King and others. Mr. Wallingford expects to take the trip and will worthily represent this city of the North.

An extensive programme of entertainment has been arranged for Jan. 29th, at Quebec City. After breakfast there will be a sleighride round the city of Quebec, followed by winter sports at Battledfields Park, and a luncheon at the Parliament Buildings where Hon. Narcisse Peroteau, the Lieutenant-Governor of Quebec and Hon. Mr. Tasehereau, the Premier, will give welcome to the visitors. In the afternoon there will be a visit to the Legislature Chamber where there will be special addresses. A reception at the home of the Lieutenant-Governor, a banquet by the City of Quebec, and a midnight parade to the station will be other features. On Jan. 29th, in Montreal, the party will visit public institutions, including McGill University. After

a luncheon at the St. Denis Club the party will have the option of entertainment until the evening when the City of Montreal will entertain the visitors at dinner.

ONE EVENING SERVICE AT PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH

For a month or two the Presbyterian church intends to revert to the plan of having only one evening service. For some time past there have been two evening services held to accommodate the large attendance in the evenings. For the present however the matter seems to have adjusted itself, the morning services being more largely attended and the need for two services in the evening not being so pressing. Accordingly for the next month or so it is intended to hold only the one Sunday evening service, commencing at 7 p.m.

Attention! Householders!

Re Garbage

All table garbage should be wrapped in paper and placed in a covered garbage can. Garbage does not include ashes and chips and these must not be put in with garbage.

See that all lids are kept on your cans and that all doors of your toilets are kept closed.

Householders must supply their own garbage cans which should be kept clean and disinfected with chloride of lime.

Chloride of lime is supplied free of charge and can be had by applying at the City Hall.

Tin cans and other dry garbage may be put in covered barrels or boxes or bags.

Special attention should be paid to your yard. Keep it clean, and so avoid sickness and disease.

Outside toilets should be fly-proof, and should be disinfected quite often.
