### YOUNG MINER AT KIRKLAND DIES BEFORE OPERATION.

Ernest Littlejohn, employed at a Kirkland Lake Mine, died last week while about to undergo a minor operation on one of his fingers. He was about 25 years of age and he came from Innerkip, near Woodstock Ont. The Northern News last week makes the following reference to the case: "Littlejohn who had been employed at the Teck Hughes mine had had the forefinger of his right hand jammed against a bucket at the property. About one inch of flesh was taken off the top of the finger, leaving the bone protruding. Dr. Armstrong happened to be at the property at the time and he took the young man to his office to have the bone removed. Dr. Lake, assistant to Dr. Armstrong administered the anaesthetic, and while Littlejohn was going under its influence the doctors noticed the patient had stopped breathing. Prompt measures restored the natural action but Littlejohn again collapsed and this time did not revive."
