PETITION re WAWAITIN  
ROAD TO BE CONSIDERED.

Mr. C. H. Fullerton, of the Northern Ontario Development Branch has acknowledged the receipt of the petition of the settlers who recently wrote the Government asking for a summer road from Timmins to Wawatin. Mr. Fullerton says that the matter will be gone into when considering the programme for next season's work.

NOT A CASE OF CONTAGIOUS  
DISEASE IN TIMMINS NOW.

Sanitary Inspector I. Dunn last week made mention of the fact that there were only two places in town under quarantine, so that the Town could be considered as very free from anything in the line of epidemics. This week he has even better news. Now, there is not a single case of quarantine for contagious disease in the Town of Timmins. The two cases referred to last week have had the quarantine lifted, and the Town is now in the enviable position of being absolutely free from contagious diseases of any kind. Timmins has always had a good record in this matter and it is pleasing to see the record maintained. However, it is well to note that good records like this are not a matter of luck. In the past it has been the carelessness and interest of the Board of Health and its officials that has made the good record possible. People in general have assisted, though there have been a few cases where carelessness or worse on the part of quarantined citizens threatened general danger.

With the Board of Health continuing its previous policy, and with the co-operation of the people in general Timmins may safely expect to continue its good luck in the matter of epidemics and diseases.
