FEARED KIRKLAND LAKE MAN MET WITH FOUL PLAY.

Two residents of Kirkland Lake, Northern Ontario gold town, have disappeared and it is thought that they are the victims of foul play.

On January 25, Herbert Highstead, 27-year-old son of Mrs. Geo. Highstead, of 27 Mount Royal avenue, Toronto, left his boarding house at Kirkland Lake and has not been heard of since. He is thought to have had a gold watch and \$150 cash with him. Provincial police have not yet been able to find trace of him.

Highstead had been living at the boarding house run by a man named Mahon, since he started a tailoring business in the town last November. His wife and baby live in Huntsville, where the Highstead family lived. Then on February 6, Richard M. Smith, aged 39 who came to the town from Charlottetown, disappeared under similar circumstances. It is said he also had \$100 with him at the time he left his boarding house and never returned.

Mrs. Highstead, remarking on the disappearance of Smith, as well as her boy, now feels that the two men have been the victims of thugs.

ARGONAUT MILL NOW READY FOR OPERATION

Announcement was made last week by the Argonaut Gold Mines, Limited, that full power service would be turned into the Argonaut Transmission line at the week-end, and that Dr. R. Thomas, general superintendent, had advised the company that he planned to put the mill in operation again on Monday next. The official announcement was made by J. A. Naud, vice-president of Argonaut Gold, on receipt of confirmation from the mine.

In addition to re-opening the enlarged mill for permanent operation the development programme below the ground will be speeded up by the addition of new equipment to a record level. Electrification of all hoisting and other machinery, for which equipment is in place will relieve the air lines to an extent which will permit doubling the operating drill capacity. This will be done immediately. The development campaign in addition to opening the 750-foot level, will include the deepening of both shaft and winze and connecting them at depth.


