**EARLY START SHOULD BE
MADE ON ROAD WORK.**

In years past, it would appear that the Ontario Government authorities concerned have made a practice of so wasting time in the early part of the season that road work in this North Land has never been carried through with the despatch and economy that it might have been. The season is always so far advanced before actual work is undertaken on the roads that either work is suspended before completion on account of the weather conditions, or else attempt is made, with loss of time and satisfaction, to carry on operations despite the weather. The season for road-work in this North Land is not any too long. An early start on the roads that are to be built or repaired is practically imperative. During the months that are past, the Government has had ample time and opportunity to make decisions and arrangements regarding the roads necessary to be built or repaired. Everything should be ready so that as soon as weather conditions permit, active operations may be commenced. This is the only practical and economical way. The Timmins Board of Trade, the Associated Boards of Trade, the Timmins Conservative Association and other North Land organizations have passed resolutions earnestly urging "an early start on road work in the North Land." It is to be hoped that the present Government will follow the idea behind these resolutions. An early start on road work will be alike to the advantage of the country and the credit of the Government.

**TORONTO MEMBER WANTS
POWER AND PULP EMBARGO**

In the House of Commons at Ottawa last week Mr. H. C. Hocken, one of the Toronto Members, while speaking on the budget, strongly advocated duties on the export of power from Canada. He also advocated imposition of an embargo or export tax on the export of pulpwood, so as to develop the papermaking industry, as he phrased it. An export duty on pulpwood would be O.K., perhaps, if it did not apply to pulpwood from the lands of settlers. Will the people who are advocating an embargo on pulpwood agree to exempting the settler? If so, there will be little objection to their proposal. The settler, however, has to cut the pulpwood to clear his land. The pulpwood has to be sold or wasted. It is simply a question of a fair price. Experience this year suggests that without United States competition the settlers will not get a fair price for their pulpwood. The question of conservation does not enter into the matter, as the pulpwood simply has to be cut to clear the land. As for the establishment of new pulp and paper-making plants in Canada, why not wait until the Mettagami Pulp & Paper Co. has paid the settlers for the wood secured four years ago?
