Active Development on the Huddleston Claims in Cody Township. Properties in Deloro, Shaw and Other Townships Also under Special Notice. Other Interesting Items from South Porcupine Correspondent.

Over seven hundred feet of Diamond Drill Core was shipped Monday from the Huddleston Group of Claims in Cody Township to Rochester

where they will be assayed. The formation consists of Quartz and Schist and heavily mineralized and is similar to that of some of our best mines. Diamond Drilling was started on March 9th under the direction of Consulting Engineer, H. H. Waters, A.I.M.M., M.I.M.E., representative of the British Interests who have the property under option. The group comprises 16 claims in all and are situated in the Northwest corner of Cody Township. A Contract was let for 3000 ft. of Diamond Drilling. The property was examined by the same people some time ago and assays to date have been very encouraging. The Consulting Engineer will accompany the shipment of core and samples to Rochester. The results are expected to be far above the average in view of the fact that the Quartz is heavily Schisted throughout. Under these conditions it was almost impossible to keep the core together and the Drills had to work much slower than regular speed. A most satisfactory report is expected from these promising group of claims in the near future.

The Township and Council are to be complimented on the prompt action they have taken in clearing the snow and ice off of the sidewalks on the Main streets of the town, making it pleasant as well as safe for pedestrians to travel, besides allowing them the long sought opportunity of again getting a good trip on the Terra Firma.

A small gang of men are working on the James Claims, about four miles South of South Porcupine in the Township of Deloro. Considerable work has been done on these properties to date and assays obtained are satisfactory enough to warrant installation of a small mill which will most likely be erected during the course of the coming Summer. Adjoining claim-holders are watching with keen interest the developments of James claims which will no doubt help them in locating ore bodies on their respective properties. Much activity is expected in this section during the next few months.
