REPORT OF NEW FAST TRAIN FROM TORONTO TO NORTH

There was a report in circulation last week in Toronto to the effect that a new fast train will be put on by the Canadian National Railways to run from Toronto to Timmings, Iroquois Falls and Cochrane. This train, it was said would commence operations about May 15th, and would leave Toronto each day in the early afternoon, pass through North Bay about midnight and reach this part of the North in the morning. Confirmation of the report was not available either from the C.N.R. or the T. & N.O. At the same time there was no positive denial regarding it. Should such a train be operated, it is likely that its return trip would be made to leave Timmings in the late afternoon or in the evening. Another Toronto report suggests that the C.N.R. would only operate the train as far as North Bay leaving the T. & N.O. to supply connections from North Bay to the North. A statement by Mr. Geo. W. Lee suggests that the T. & N. O. would be quite ready to supply such connection. There may be nothing at all in the report. On the other hand the recent suggestion made by Mr. R. A. Melnnis, of Iroquois Falls, in a letter to The Advance may be much nearer being fulfilled than many people thought at all possible.

The Northern News last week says: "Miss Jane Caldbick, daughter of Sheriff and Mrs. Caldbick, who had her leg broken while skiing on January 4, is improving at her home. It is expected the plaster cast will be removed from the injured leg in about a week."

Dainty Desserts for the Kiddies

Simple, wholesome, nourishing, appetizing, these St. Charles recipes are but a few of the many you can easily prepare with this rich, pure country milk. It is economy as well as a convenience to "use it wherever the recipe calls milk". Your grocer has it—four handy sizes.

Cup Custard
 1/2 cup St. Charles Milk, 1/2 cup water, 1 egg beaten, 2 tablespoons sugar, 1/2 saltspoon salt, nutmeg and vanilla.
 Dilute St. Charles milk with the water and bring to scalding point. Add sugar and salt to beaten egg. Pour over then gradually scalded milk, flavor to taste, pour in custard cups. Place in deep pan and pour boiling water around until it nearly reaches top of cups. Bake in moderate oven about twenty minutes.

Spanish Cream
 1 1/2 cups St. Charles Milk, diluted with 1 1/2 cups water, 1/2 teaspoonful salt, 1/2 cupful sugar, 3 eggs, 1 1/2 tablespoonsful granulated gelatine, 1 teaspoonful vanilla.
 Let gelatine stand in the milk for five minutes, then scald the mixture. Combine egg-yolks, sugar and salt with the scalded milk, and cook until slightly thickened like a custard. Then stir mixture into egg whites beaten stiff; add vanilla. Turn into individual moulds which have been dipped in cold water and when set, un mould and serve with light cream, or preserved fruit.

Prune Snow
 1/2 cupful St. Charles Milk, 1/2 cupful water, 1 pint well cooked, pitted prunes, 1/2 cupful granulated sugar, 1/2 teaspoonful butter, 2 egg-whites, 1/2 cupful powdered sugar.
 Combine the prunes, milk, granulated sugar and butter in a shallow baking dish. Make a meringue of the two egg whites and powdered sugar; spread it over prunes, place in very slow oven; bake fifteen to twenty minutes, when milk will be absorbed by prunes and the meringue a delicate brown.
