## GENERAL HEALTH OF NORTH REPORTED AS VERY GOOD

This year no smallpox cases have been discovered by the authorities and only two or three cases of typhoid are known to exist in the health district."

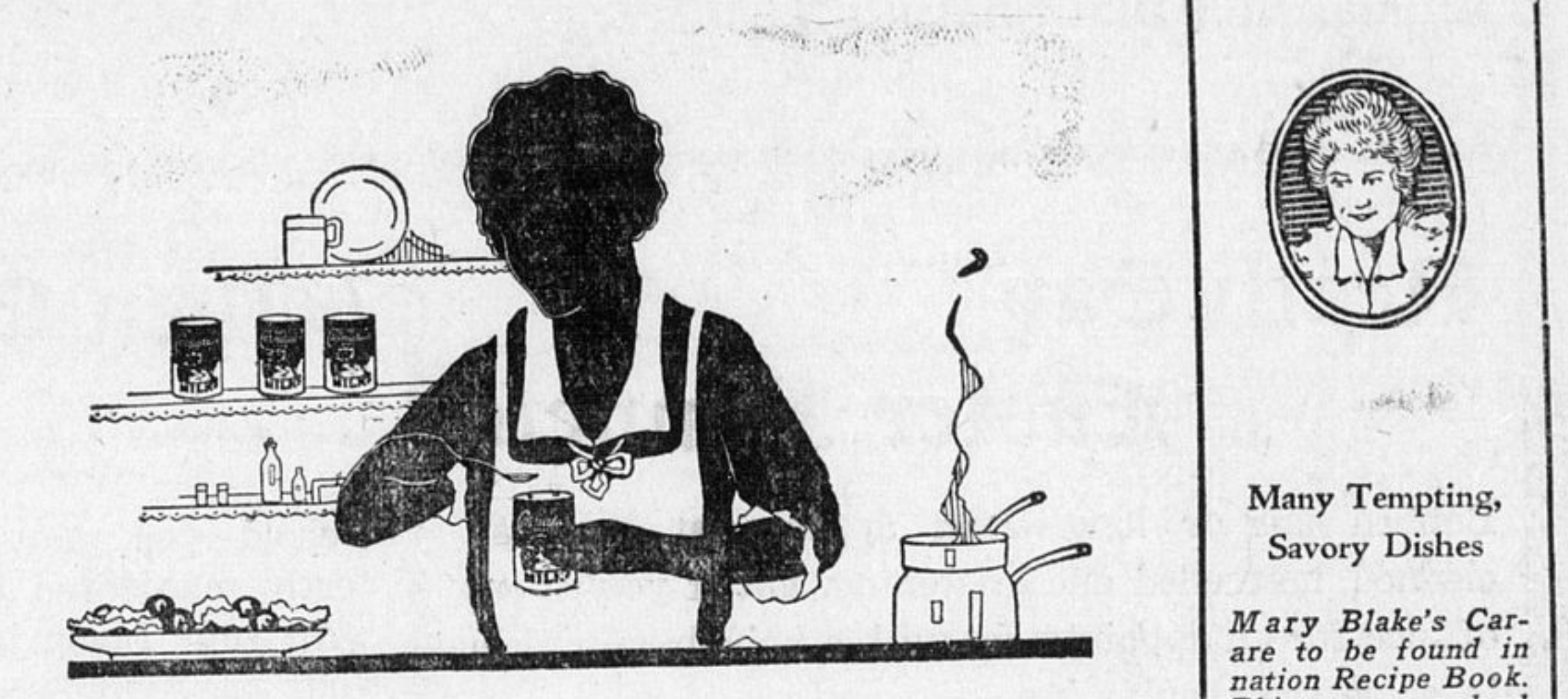
