Expect to Build 40 Miles of North Highway This Year

Contracts for Highway Through North Are to be Let in Five Mile Blocks. Tenders to be Called Soon for Eight of These 5 Mile Blocks. Hoped to Have Work All Completed Next Year.

Some days ago a deputation went down from North Bay to see the Ontario Government relative to the North Land Highway. The delegation wanted to see an early start made on the building of the highway, and the North Bay representatives were

equally concerned about the completion of the highway. They were given all sorts of hopeful information in the matter. In referring to the visit to Toronto of the delegation, The North Bay Nugget last week says: "The Northern Highway from

North Bay to the mining fields will be let by contract, according to advices given the North Bay delegation at Toronto last week. It is planned to call for tenders at once for eight five-mile contracts to be finished this fall.

"These contracts, to be let in five-mile sections, will call for completed roads from the clearing, rock-cutting, filling and grading to the finished surfacing.

"It is hoped to have 40 miles of the road finished this coming fall and the remainder in another year. Funds for the building of the road have been provided in the \$5,000,000 grant for colonization roads in Northern Ontario.

"The slashing for the road to Cobalt has been completed. The engineers are now busy on profile maps for grades and as soon as they are completed, the specifications needed for the contractors will be available and work will be rushed through.

"By cutting the contract into five-mile blocks, the Government hopes to give more of the small contractors a chance to bid on the work."

The North Bay delegation took up the matter of other roadways desired by North Bay to be done this year. The situation in regard to this other road work is referred to by The Nugget. The Nugget in this connection says:—

"The matter of a permanent road to Callander has not yet been settled but it was pointed out to the Bay delegates that the \$5,000,000 appropriation for Northern roads will build many and the efforts of North Bay will hereafter be directed at the Department of Lands and Forests for approval by that department will mean that the work can be undertaken this year. The same department will deal with the matter of assistance in the building of the overhead bridge at Golf Street. Unless the item is covered in supplementary estimates, this week, there is little chance of a new gaol for North Bay this year. The sum of \$80,000 for this was granted last year but was not used, though the Provincial Secretary's department approved the site and plans. They were referred to the Department of Public Works and apparently have become mired in some of the files. Strong representation will be made to the Government, this week, to have the grant restored and the work undertaken this year."

CHILDREN MAY HELP TO AVOID MOTOR ACCIDENTS

Ontario Motor League Again Offering Prizes for Essays

Announcement is made of another prize essay-writing competition for children in Ontario public and separate schools.

The Ontario Motor League has again offered, through the Ontario Safety League, two hundred and forty cash prizes, totalling three hundred dollars, for compositions on "How Children May Help to Avoid Motor Accidents."

The rules governing the contest are: Any school child in Ontario may compete.

The composition may be either prose or verse, and must be written in English. If prose, it must not consist of more than 150 words. If in verse, it must be confined to sixteen lines.

The composition must be the sole work of the pupil submitting it, and in the pupil's own handwriting.

The composition must be written on ruled paper, with a margin on left side, written in ink, on one side of the paper only, and confined to one sheet.

Neatness, spelling, and general composition will be taken into consideration in awarding the prizes.

The full name, age, name of school and street address of the pupil must be written at the bottom of the paper.

For Rural Schools—Name of Principal.

Post office address and number of Rural Delivery Route must be given.

The composition must be confined to one subject—"How Children May Help to Avoid Motor Accidents."

The contest will close May 15, 1925. The decision of the judges shall be final.

All papers are to be handed to the teacher, who will send them to the principal, to be forwarded to the League.

There will be two classes in the prizes offered:

- (a) Scholars of 12 years and under.
 - (b) Scholars of 13 years and over.
- The 120 prizes in each class will be: 2nd and 3rd.....\$ 5.00 each 4th and 7th.....\$ 3.00 each 8th and 12th.....\$ 2.00 each and 108.....\$ 1.00 each The prize money will be forwarded

to the winning contestants June 10, 1925.

Very valuable results have come from past competitions, and it is hoped that increased benefits to children may come from the 1925 contest. In order to secure a greater range of interest, teachers are requested to prescribe this subject for a class composition, if possible.
