
FACTS ABOUT TEA SERIES-No. 5

What 'Orange Pekoe' Means

If, however, the plant is grown at a low elevation, it may still be 'Orange Pekoe' but also be of very poor quality. The consumer's only safeguard is to buy a tea of recognized goodness. President: Mr. R. Jackson. Secretary-Treasurer: Mr. P. B.




