

High Pressure Salesmen Still at Their Wrong Games

In recent issues of The Advance mention has been made of the trick employed by some "high pressure" salesmen of attempting to induce people to trade well-known stocks for new issues that, to put it very mildly are of doubtful value. This question is dealt with in a special letter sent out by the Bank of Commerce. The Bank of Commerce letter quotes from a similar letter sent out by the Financial Service, Limited, Montreal, as

.. One of the chief tinancial nuisances of the day in Montreal and vicinity (and the same applies to Timmins) is the group of stock salesmen the new teacher at the Public Schools who pester shareholders of one company to switch into another stock, leave of absence on account of illness. very frequently of doubtful value and sometimes worthless stuff. People who have sound listed securities are the ones mostly approached, owing to the readiness with which these can be turned into cash and the proceeds applied to the purchase of the offering they are making.

"Women shareholders are considered easy marks for these shark individuals and it would be well for them to consult their husbands before taking any action, or in the cases of spinsters and widows, their bankers, or some reliable, well-informed financial friend who is willing to give them) conservative advice.
