Hamilton Board of Trade To Visit Timmins in June

About Fifty in Party from the Ambitious City to Make Tour of the North Next Month. Will be in Timmins from 12.30 noon to 7 p.m., in Wednesday, June 10th. Will be Guests of Timmins Board of Trade While Here.

Last year at the meeting of the Ontario Associated Board of Trade in Toronto, delegates from Hamilton were given hearty invitation to visit Timmins and the North Land. Apparently the invitations were favourably received, for last week the local Board of Trade received a letter from the Hamilton Board of Trade to the effect that the City of Hamilton Board of Trade intended to make a tour of the North Land this summer, and that Timmins would be on the list of places of call. The party from Hamilton will include about fifty representative business and professional men of the Ambitious City. The party left Hamilton on Sunday, May 17th, and among the places visited in this North Land will be: Sudbury, Sturgeon Falls, North Bay, Cobalt, Liskeard, Englehart, Larder Lake, Timmins, Iroquois Falls, Island Falls, Cochrane and Temagami. The visitors will be at Larder Lake early

on June 10th, then coming on to Timmins. They will reach here by special train about 12.30 noon and will remain in Timmins until 7 p.m. From here they will proceed to Iroquois Falls for the evening and part of June 11th. Then on to Island Falls. Returning from Island Falls, the evening of the 11th, will be spent at Cochrane. The party will return south on the 11th, stopping at Temagami for a day's outing on the water, and reaching North Bay on the evening of June 12th. From North Bay they proceed south again to Hamilton, Ont.

While in Timmins the visitors will be the guests of the Timmins Board of Trade, and they are assured of the very heartiest welcome here.

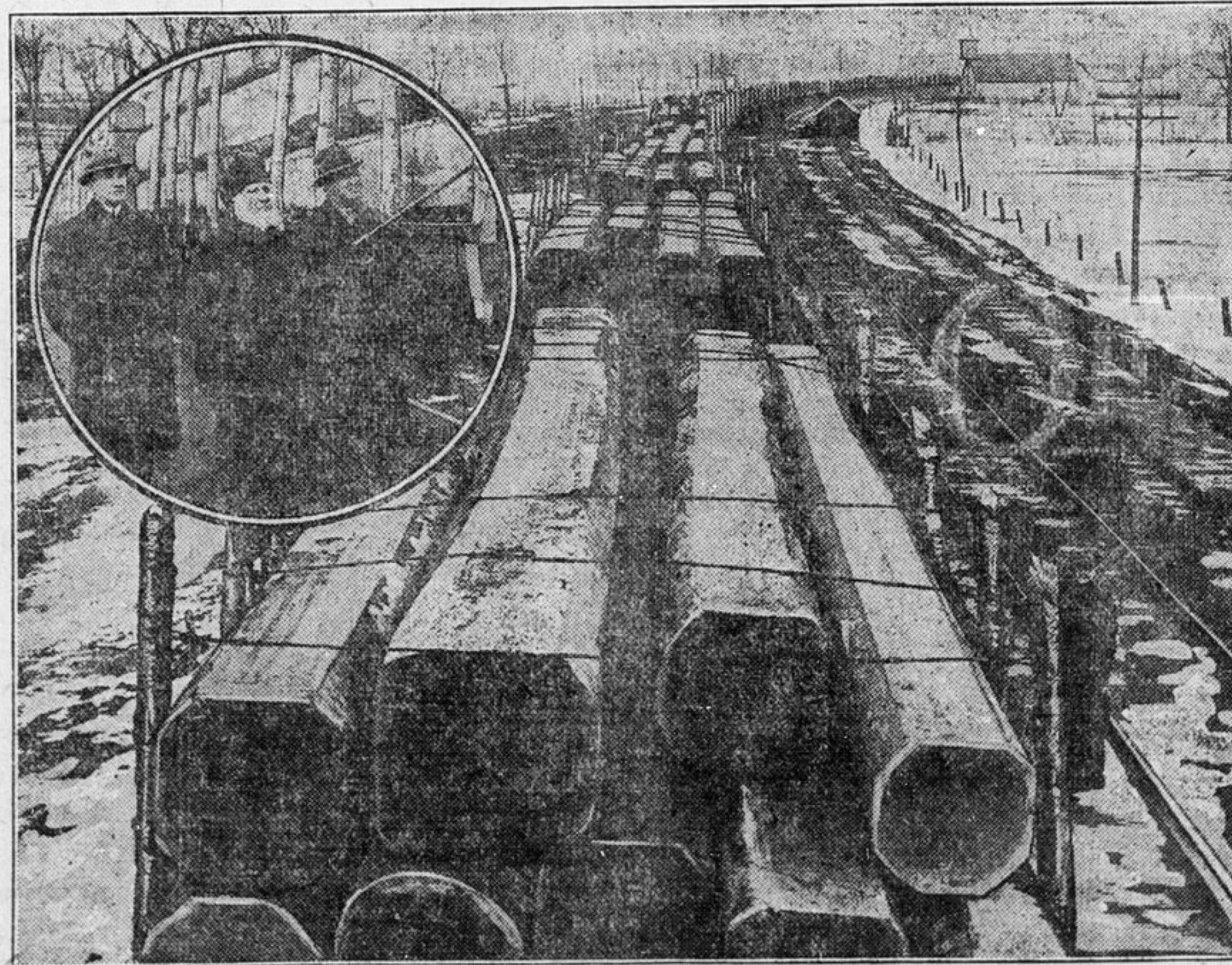

ONTARIO WHITE PINE FOR BRITAIN'S WARSHIPS.



The photograph shows one of four trainloads of virgin white pine logs cut from the Egan limits in Preston and Clancy Townships in the Algonquin Park District, which were sent recently via the Canadian National Railways to Quebec for shipment to England on the order of the British Admiralty. The timber was hand hewn by the J. R. Booth Company of Ottawa and it is the finest shipment sent from Ontario in the memory of lumbermen. In some instances the timber was three feet in diameter and in no case was it less than two feet through. The shipment required 120 flat cars and aggregated 120,000 cubic feet of timber.

Inset are seen from left to right the following members of the J. R. Booth Company: C. Jackson Booth, Vice-President, J. R. Booth, President and J. Fred Booth, Managing Director. Mr. J. R. Booth, Canada's venerable lumber king visited the railway yards to see the timber, and in spite of the fact that he is in his ninety-ninth year, he exhibited a lively interest in the shipment and walked almost the full length of the train during his inspection. It was Mr. Booth's foresight which preserved for his company such remarkable stands of timber as that from which this virgin white pine was cut. Experts agree that it is the finest white pine left in Canada.
