"A dissent, signed by Rev. J. A MacInnis, minister of St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church, New Liskeard, and by James Paterson, elder, Englehart, against the merging of Presbytery in a new body and proclaiming their intention (with as many as will adhere to them) to continue the Presbytery of Temiskaming as a court of the Presbyterian Church, was presented by Mr. MacInnis at the final meeting of the Presbytery before the consummation of union. The session was held in New Liskeard on Tuesday of this week.

"Mr. MacInnis, as Moderator, occupied the chair, but he resigned his office during the day, and this will take effect on June 10, when Church Union will become an accomplished fact. His successor in the chair will be Rev. J. D. Parks, minister of Byrnes' Presbyterian Chuch, Timmins. Mr. MacInnis was appointed Interim Moderator for St. Paul's Presbyterian Church, Englehart (which is not] entering the union), in room of Rev. 4 J. O. Watts, Haileybury, United Church, who resigned. Rev. C. T. Sylvester, former pastor of the Englehart church, resigned his charge some time ago as the result of difference of opinion over the burning question, and his resignation was accepted by 3
