**Timmins Football Team Again Champions of the North Land**

**By Winning From Dome on Saturday, Timmins Team Holds Championship of Northern Ontario. Further Games Not Yet Announced.**

Timmins Football Club are away again in the Ontario Cup matches, and are now Champions of the North once again. Although they have been unlucky in drawing away from home in both matches, they have lived up to their reputation, and it is hoped they will be lucky enough to have some home matches in the remaining fixtures. The draw has not been made yet for the next round, although it was published in another paper that it had been made.

The results of the matches so far were:—Timmins at Kirkland Lake, score was 2-0 in favour of Timmins; and last Saturday they defeated the Dome at the Dome 4-1, the Dome's goal going in off Liddle's body. The feature of Saturday's match was the refereeing by Mr. Meath of Kirkland Lake. He made the teams play football from start to finish, and the off-side rule he was very strict on. He also warned four Dome men and one of Timmins for offences against the rules.

The teams for Saturday's match were as follows:—  
Dome—Hendry, goal; Fell and Butt backs; S. Harrower, H. Harrower and Kellow, half-backs; Goodman, Dougall, Robson, Walker and Hawkins, forwards.  
Timmins—Erick, goal; Hetherington and Liddle, backs; Cooper, F. Cadman and Short, half-backs; Street, Satrang, Petterson, A. Cadman and Dunbar, forwards.

The Dome won the toss and set Timmins facing a strong sun. Timmins kicked off. Bobby Harrower got the ball and returned it to his forwards. Robson missed a good chance to score, Liddle robbing, and sent Dunbar away on the left. Satrang got the pass and was diverted to the wing by Fell and made a fine shot from his awkward position and just missed the net. The Dome came away again, Hetherington cleared, Goodman got possession and sent in a dangerous ground shot. Erick came prone to save and the ball hit his shoulder and bounced up. He was quick on his feet and caught the ball as Robson came rushing in and kicked. For this he was promptly warned for dangerous play. Timmins made an attack. Butt cleared. A. Cadman got the leather and passed it out to Street, who dribbled his way down touch and passed the leather to Petterson who scored with a fine shot. The Dome pressed and were awarded a corner. Hawkins sent in a fine centre. Erick fisted out to Fergy Cadman who sent Street away again and he got in another fine centre. Butt cleared and the referee had to warn both R. Harrower and Street for an infringement of the rules. A. Cadman got the ball to Satrang who took a long shot and Hendry fisted over. The corner was cleared and the Dome got a corner awarded them which was kicked out. Timmins now put on the pace and kept the Dome in their own quarters. The halves were feeding the forwards well. Petterson headed in. Hendry saved and made a weak clearance, for Micky again headed, and went in for a rebound but Hendry bounced the ball out. A. Cadman came in and forced him to bounce it over for a corner. This was fruitless. Harrower got his men going again. Erick was called on to make a fine save, but Robson was quick on the

ball and sent in a high shot. Short cleared with his head as it was on its way under the bar. Dunbar and A. Cadman came down. The latter just missed. This was followed by a short pass combination by A. Cadman, Petterson and Satrang, the latter kicking wide. Cooper got them off again. Petterson made an opening and passed to Satrang who shot the ball over Butt's head and into the net. The pace was good and fast now. The ball was everywhere until Goodman got it and sent over a pass. Robson headed. Erick was just in the act of catching it, when Liddle got in the way, the ball glancing off his body into the net. Timmins again rushed. Hendry ran out to save and handled the ball out of his area and a free kick was awarded. The whistle blew for half time before this could be taken. Half-time score, 2-1.

The Second half started off with Timmins on the offensive and forced a corner which was cleared. The Dome got in close but were pulled up for offside. The Dome missed a fine chance when Walker had the goal at his mercy; his shot, however, went yards wide. At the other end Hendry saved from Street. The Dome came down again and a free kick was awarded them just outside the penalty area. Kellow took the kick and used bad judgment, the ball going wide. Timmins had the Dome beat at every play now and the forward combination was just like clockwork. A. Cadman was the next to have a shot, but booted over the bar. Satrang came down and beat Butt, but Butt, thought it smart in tripping Satrang. The referee was smarter and awarded a penalty, which Satrang took and scored. Hendry again saved from Satrang and stood holding the ball when Cadman again made him bounce it out again for a corner. Street put in a fine flag kick; Cadman headed to Petterson the latter scoring. The play went over to the left. Fergy passed to Dunbar. Hendry ran out and pulled Dunbar down by the shoulder. He was promptly warned. Timmins was caught offside at the free kick. The Dome went down again. Goodman got dangerous and Fergy gave them a corner in stopping the pass. The corner kick was a good one and Cooper was called on to clear and sent the leather to Dunbar. Satrang got the pass and shot wide. The match was nearing the end when Hendry again tried his smart stuff on Dunbar by trying to bring him down again. He however, got the worst of it. Dunbar dodged and Hendry came down with a heavy thud. The spectators were now yelling, "Give the Dome a kick at the ball." They did. Erick ran out to save, giving them a corner, which was fruitless, and their last kick was when Walker again shot wide.

Timmins worked well; the defense was sound, and the halves intercepted and fed well; while the forwards were combining well and helped the halves by running back to check.  
For the Dome, Fell worked hard at back and is a good sprinter. Sandy Harrower was the best half. Bobby directed the attacks, while Shorty Goodman and Walker were the best forwards. Dougall and Robson both worked hard.

Right after the change of ends, Adamson beat his way through the backs, and Dedrickson made a fine save of his shot. The Hollinger came down in combination, the leather going from Petterson, Satrang to Landers. The latter shot wide. The Hollinger forced a corner and Landers sent in a fine flag kick. Cadman fisted clear. At the other end Dedrickson saved a shot from Lambles's pass. The Town got in another dangerous shot which Dedrickson cleared. He made another sensational save right after this which the crowd greatly applauded. There followed three free kicks. Fergy cleared one, while Dedrickson and A. Cadman cleared the other two. The Hollinger now pressed and a lively time ensued in the Town's area. Relief came when Short kicked over. The Hollinger were awarded another free kick. Satrang shot wide. This was followed by a corner but Dunbar kicked out. Petterson and Satrang combined well. The latter's pass was headed out for a corner. Petterson in another fine centre. Petterson got it and tapped it towards the net. Street tried to clear but the leather hit under the crossbar and bounced in for a goal. The Hollinger forced matters from now up to the end. Cadman was called on to save a shot from Dunbar's flag kick pass. This was followed by a collision, when Cadman ran out to fist out a shot and ran head-on into Satrang. Both were able to resume after a short delay though Cadman got the worst shock. The match finished just after Street cleared the ball from the goal line.

**TOWN A. AND HOLLINGER AGAIN BATTLE TO A DRAW**

Match Attracts Largest Crowd at Any Fixture This Season.

Before the largest crowd at a football match this season, the Town A. and Hollinger again fought it out to a draw, 1-1, in the P.D.F.L. fixture here on Tuesday evening of last week. The teams were:—

Town A.—A. Cadman, goal; Street and Liddle, backs; Patrick, F. Cadman and Cooper, half-backs; Lambie, Jackson, Adamson, Dunn and A. Roberts, Sr., forwards.  
Hollinger—Dedrickson, goal; Hetherington and A. Roberts, jr., backs; Short, Anderson and Stephenson, half-backs; Dunbar, Dunsmore, Petterson, Satrang and Landers, forwards.

The first half opened up with the Town having much of the argument. The Hollinger seemed to hold back and when they did get going their passes were intercepted. The Town pressed hard but were kept out of danger for half an hour. Then Roberts came down and centred. Jackson headed the pass but Dedrickson booted clear only to have Dunn follow up and score. The Town were awarded two corners after this, but both were cleared out of danger. The Hollinger now pressed to the end of the half. They got a free kick awarded them just outside the penalty area from which there was a great tussle for possession. The ball was finally cleared by A. Cadman who saved a good shot. He got another to clear before the whistle. Half time, Town 1, Hollinger nil.
