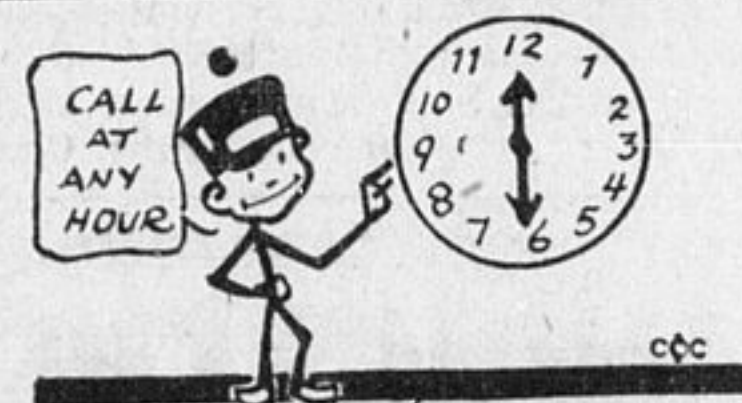

**Timmins Wins Another From Iroquois Falls, Score 7 to 3**

Nottingham's Sterling Performance on the Mound and His Timely Hitting Were the Two Main Features of the Baseball Match at the Falls on Wednesday Last.

The Timmins Baseball Club celebrated Farmers' Day on Wednesday, last at Iroquois Falls by coming from behind in the closing stages of the game and smashed out a 7-3 victory before one of the largest crowds of the season.

The Papermakers were again the first to get on the score sheet by tallying twice in the 2nd on an error and a home run by Fahey, and added one more in the 3rd on a double by McDonald and a single by Nickless.

Nottingham then got down to business and pitched airtight ball for the remainder of the game, allowing but two hits in the remaining 5 frames.

Flanders who was on the mound for the Falls looked for awhile as if he might repeat his initial performance of the season when he beat the fast-going Miners who were handicapped on the day through the absence of Tate and Scully.

The Miners scored two in the 6th, on singles by Murphy, Scully, Tate and McLean. Nottingham then came through in the 7th to tie the game up with a homer, and he helped considerably to win his own game in the 8th frame by hitting safely over 2nd which scored Tate and McLean with the winning runs of the game.

Kennedy, who was behind the plate for the Miners, caught a very nice game, and held Notty up in fine style. His throwing to 2nd was very good and two Papermakers went out stealing.

In a frantic effort to try and bolster up the Papermakers, Fritz Anson was dug up out of retirement and his comeback looked for awhile as if he might succeed, as he singled on his first time at bat. He followed that up with striking out and went out on an easy chance to right.

McDonald is easily the pick of the Papermakers line up and his hitting and fielding has been very good and consistent all season.

McLean and Murphy came through with the batting honours of the day, with 3 safeties each, with the former adding a stolen base to his credit.

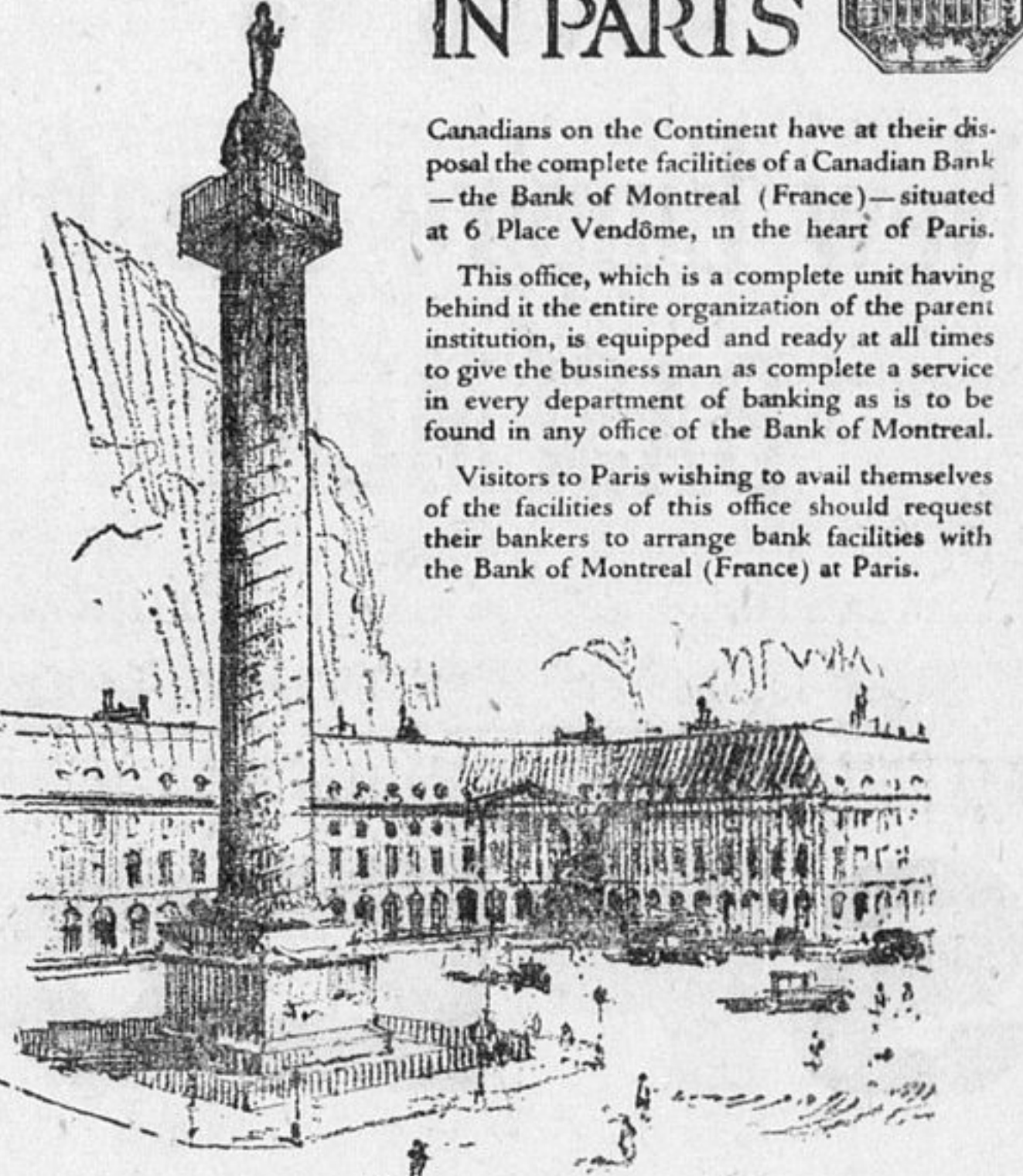
