DEPT. HAS BETTER PLANS THAN EMBARGO WOULD BE

China Clay Deposits Inspected. Minister of Lands and Forests Showing Talent in Making the Most Out of Forest Wealth.

Recent announcements from Tor-

onto indicate some of the ways adopted by Hon. Mr. Lyons to see that the Province benefits more substantially than in the past from the forest wealth here. The plans of the Dept. seem to be more practical and effective than the proposed pulpwood embargo. In offering for sale by tender certain limits, the Department, in addition specifying a new rate of \$1.40 per cord for spruce pulp dues and 70 cents per cord for balsam pulp dues, the terms also specify bonuses of 50 and 40 cents per cord, respectively, for these two classes of pulp.
