



134 cups flour, 4 teaspoons bak-ing powder, 1 tablespoon sugar, 12 teaspoon salt, 1 egg, 25 cup water, spoons fat. Mix and sift dry ingredients. Add milk and water to well beaten egg, and add to first mixture, then add melted shortening. Bake in greased muffin tins fifteen to twenty-five minutes. This makes ten muffins.

CINNAMON BUNS 34 cup water, 16 cup Carnation Milk, 3 tablespoons sugar, 1 egg, 1 teaspoon salt, 1 cake compressed yeast, 41/2 cups flour, 1/2 tablespoon cinnamon, ¼ cup sugar, ½ cup raisins, 2 tablespoons shortening.
