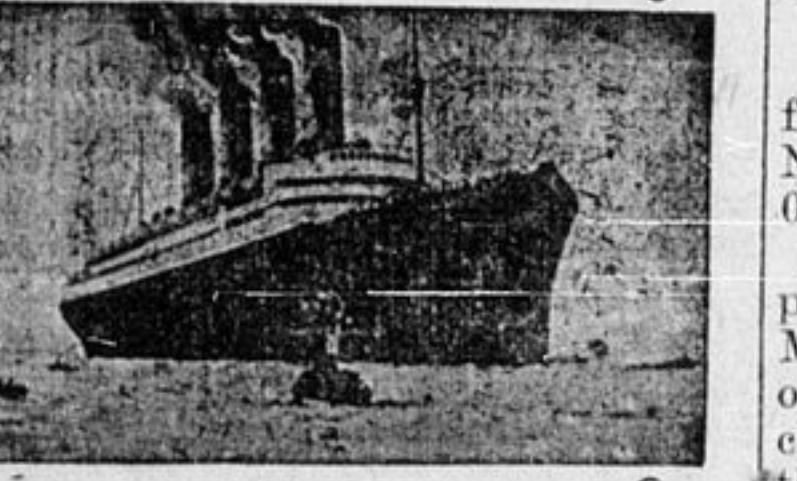

## Nottingham Turns in Fifth Straight Win for the Miners

### Leading Hurler of the Miners Proves Easy Winner. Allows the Papermakers but Three Hits. McLean Shines at Short. Tate's and Scully's Hitting Features of the Game.

On Wednesday last, Timmins tucked another ball game away in their old bat bag and with two more wins, (which they should get without any difficulty), the Miners will be certain champions of the Northern group regardless of what happens to the remaining games.

Lefty Evans, who virtually stood the hard hitting Miners on their heads a few weeks ago, was again started on the mound for the Papermakers, with hopes of a repeat, but their hopes were very short-lived as the boy with the smiling teeth lasted but 2 1-3rd innings when he was driven to the showers.

Flanders then took up the mound duty and he wasn't much of an improvement, and after Scully, Smith and Tate had doubled in succession he vacated the mound in favour of Fahey.

Fahey went along nicely until the 7th, when 3 singles and a double by Scully accounted for 3 more runs.

Nottingham's pitching was marvelous throughout this entire game. He allowed but 3 hits, and only 9 Papermakers got on the paths, five of them through free transportation to 1st, and of those that did get on, he made them hug Tate's station very closely, as two of them were picked off 1st, while another went out stealing.

McIntyre's performance behind the plate and all around work was his best effort of the season. His throwing to 2nd, was dead on, and his hitting was timely.

Tate, who is the most consistent hitter on the Miners line-up, grabbed off the batting honours of the day with two doubles and a single, while Scully followed him up with two doubles.

Murphy's work around the middle station was very good and his hitting is improving. He was painfully hurt in the face when a ground hit ball took a bad hop and hit him in the face. After a short delay for repairs he was able to resume play.

Johnny Monaghan accepted all his fielding chances in nice style and he also came through with a clean single.

McLean's work at short was his best effort of the season, and his catch of Spence's fly in the 6th frame in short left was a very nice piece of work.

Smith and McGrath each had one chance in the outfield and they were accepted in good style.
