In spite of the mud and water both teams were working hard to get the lead. Schumacher started down off the right, but Dougall's pass was intercepted by Stephenson who sent the ball up to Pettersen and after a nice piece of individual play got the leather by Wills for the lead.

The Hollinger pressed from the change-over, but the Schumacher defence was sound, and kept them out. The Schumacher forwards came down and Robson missed a good chance, by slipping down in the mud with only Dedrickson to beat.
