## Miners Make Strong Finish Beating Papermakers 6 to 3

Iroquois Falls Scores Three in the First Frame, but Nottingham Holds Them Scoreless for the Remainder of the Game. Tate's Sensational Fielding and Good Hitting Largely Responsible for Victory.

McDonald and his crew of Pulperaters certainly didn't take it very kindly when the Gold Diggers stepped out in the dying moments of the game and smashed out a win on Tuesday, July 28th, at Iroquois Falls. And what made this pill just a little bit harder for the Papermakers to swallow was the fact that they were leading 3 to 0 up to the 5th frame, and 3 to 1 up to the fateful 8th when things began to happen. And the home stuff umpiring that they had been receiving throughout the entire game didn't help them any at all in the 8th and it all happened in this manner.

With one out, McLean beat out a bit to deep short and went to 2nd on McDonald's wild peg to 1st. Smith obliged with a single, Dunc taking 3rd and Smith to 2nd no play being made on him. Tate who had been hitting and fielding in sensational style throughout the entire game and who can usually be depended upon to give a good account of himself at all times certainly came through in fine style by smashing out an honest single which scored McLean and Smith with the tying runs.

Tate then stole 2nd while McIntyre became the 2nd out on a fly to left. McGrath was then given a walk while Murphy scored Tate with his 3rd hit of the game. McDonald, who had singled, tried to stretch it to a double and he was out at 2nd without a doubt, and that decision delayed the game for about 10 minutes and Oscar Girard who was calling them behind the Plate, and who is incidentally an ex-Papermaker, declared that Timmins shouldn't kick at only one bad decision as he had received many of them himself at Timmins several years ago, and he apparently took this opportunity of evening up matters for his fancied wrongs, and along with his side kick who was umpiring on the bases they sure did more than make up for all the bad decisions that they got in the last 5 years. After order was restored and play was resumed Nickless walked. He was then forced at 2nd and with a double play in sight Murphy threw wild to 1st allowing McDonald to score and Gratton to 2nd. Smith then misjudged Cunningham's fly which went for two bags, Gratton scoring on the play. Coons' single then scored Cunningham.

The Miners then settled down and staged an uphill battle against the Papermakers' 3-run deficit and their nubs, the Umps. They finally succeeded in the last stages of the game. The Papermakers refused to call the game in time to allow the Miners to change clothes and make train connections and as a result they were forced to change on the train after Fritz Anson had kindly rushed them over to the station in his car.

### SETTLERS ENTITLED TO PROTECTION, SAYS POST

The Northland Post, of Cochrane, last week says:—  
"During their interview with the Ontario Cabinet recently, the delegation from the Northern Ontario Associated Boards of Trade took up with the Minister of Lands and Forests the matter of the Mattagami Pulp & Paper Co's debts to settlers, dating from 1921 when the company went into liquidation, and urged that the Government do its utmost to protect the settlers in case of any re-organization as is under contemplation. This is a protection which the settlers are fully entitled to, and it is hoped that Hon. Jas. Lyons, Minister of Lands and Forests, will not permit the transfer of any limits until the claims of the settlers are settled in full. The Timmins Advance this week had timely comment on this question."
