## Upper School Examination At Timmins High School

Pupils Wrote on 65 Papers and Secured Pass on Honour Standing in 59. The Number of Honours Was 35, Miss Beatrice McCracken Has Honours in All but One Subject, Five Being First Class Honours.

In this examination candidates may write on one or more papers as desired. C. indicates a pass 50 to 59 per cent; 1 first class honours, 75 per cent or over; 2 second-class honours, 66 to 74 per cent; 3 third-class honours 80 to 65 per cent. Pupils of Timmins High School wrote on 65 papers and secured pass or honour standing in 59, a per centage of 91. The number of honours was 35 or 54 per cent.

Applicants for Normal Schools may secure their certificates at the Principal's Office at the High School.

In this examination Miss Beatrice McCracken made a particularly creditable showing, passing on all the subjects taken and securing honour standing in all but one. In five of the subjects Miss McCracken secured first-class honours, while she had also two second-class honours and three third-class honours. Miss Roma Porter, Miss Dorothy Porter and Miss Marianne Colborne also did very well. Miss Roma Porter took first-class honours in three subjects. Miss Dorothy Porter had second-class honours in five subjects as well as making over 60 per cent. on three other subjects.

### CANADA LYNX REPORTED AS SEEN NEAR GOWGANDA.

The Advance believes its readers are specially interested in the wild life of this North Land, and that any facts about the animals or birds in this country are always acceptable. Even some of the wolf stories are of interest, so long as it is distinctly understood that they are not to be believed. But, naturally, anything true about the birds or beasts that are native to the country or that show disposition to permanently locate here are particularly worthy of note.

The general opinion of old-timers is that the Canadian lynx is rather a

rare animal in these parts these days, though it was not always so. Old-timers have no unusual desire to have the lynx return here in force. Anything along the line of the "wild cat" order would do this country no good. According to an item in the last issue of The Northern News, the lynx is not yet extinct in this North Land. A Canada lynx, described as "standing as high as a desk" was seen a few days ago on the Gowganda road by motorist from Cobalt. He spotted across the road in front of the car and stood at the side of the road while the car stopped and the party looked him over. He appeared to be entirely unafraid.

### BUCKE TOWNSHIP WANTS ENQUIRY INTO FINANCES.

A judicial enquiry into the financial affairs of Bucke Township, covering the period following the fire of October, 1922, will be asked by the municipal council here, if the township's solicitor approves of the proposal according to an item in The Northern News. The decision in the matter followed a public meeting called by the Council to learn the people's wishes on the question. Figures shown by the Government audit and by the township's own official seem to indicate a shortage of some \$4,780.00 in municipal funds. A judicial enquiry, it is expected, would disclose whether the alleged shortage is actually a shortage and, if so, how it occurred and why.
