

COMMUNITY HALL AND ARFNA FOR HAILEYBURY

It may be an inopportune time to suggest a new town hall or a community hall or anything like that for Timmins. In the past projects along this line have been made as long as ten years ago. Once, the matter progressed to the stage of a public meeting of representatives of practically every organization and interest in town. This meeting appointed a committee to report further at another meeting. The committee never reported. Since then all three members of the committee have left the town altogether. Various reasons have caused the question to be dropped, though the need is apparent enough. At the present time with practically no one recovered, eitherfinancially or tempermentally, from the paying of the first installment of the year's municipal taxes, it would be something similar to suicide to advocate too loudly for a community hall or town hall or anything else that would cost money.

However, information from Haileybury brings the idea to notice. Haileybury believes it has every reason to expect that a new community hall and arena will be erected at Haileybury in the near future. It is the intention to finance the project with the proceeds of the insurance on the armories. An Order-in-Council has been passed providing for the turning over of the amount of \$33,-500, voted for the purpose at the last session of Parliament, to the town of Haileybury for the construction of the building, and only some minor arrangements have now to be made before the project can be gotten un-

According to The Haileyburion. the building will consist of a community hall, with one or two offices in connection, and a large arena which will be available for an armory should occasion arise. The arena, as shown on the plans, will be 70x170 feet with an arched roof and plenty

The Haileyburian further comments that this "will be almost all that is now required to make the town of Haileybury at least as great as it was before the last big fire and the citizens will welcome the establishment of a community building which will be available for large gatherings when occasion arises."
