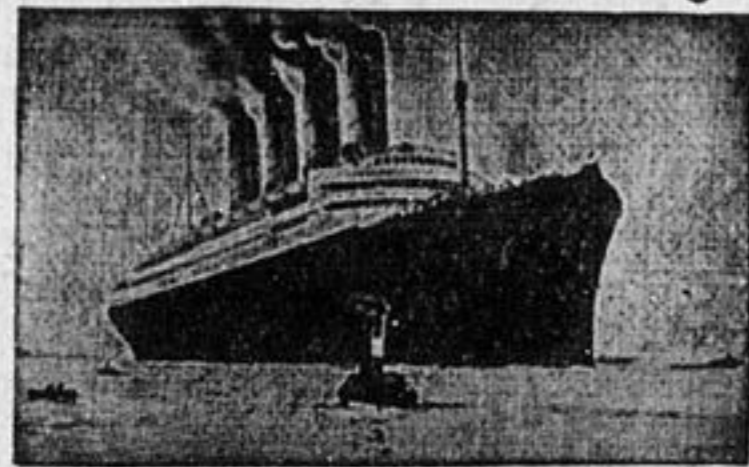

MOTOR FIRE TRUCK HAS TWO RUNS ON MONDAY

Between \$400 and \$500 Damage to Residence on Wende Street.

The Fire Dept. had two calls on Monday of this week, both showing the value of motor equipment. At 1:20 p.m. there was a call to Mrs. Levine's, 53 River Road, the alarm being sent in by phone. In some way or another one of the dog kennels had gotten on fire. The fire was under control before the brigade reached the scene, and a shot from the hand chemical tank completed the extinguishing of this fire. Only a few dollars' damage was caused.

The second Monday fire was at 8:30 p.m. The call came in from Box 63, and the fire was at No. 5 Wende St., in the western part of the town. The house was owned and occupied by Mr. Desjardins. The cause of the fire is not known, but the blaze had considerable grip before it was discovered. Much of the upstairs was gutted before the fire was stopped. The damage will run between \$400.00 and \$500.00, covered by insurance, there being \$1000.00 insurance on the property which is worth considerably more than that amount. The furniture in the house was saved from damage by water and smoke by removal from the burning building. The fire, which was running in the walls, was a difficult one to deal with, but was well handled by the brigade.

TIMMINS SCOTCH COLLIES TOP-NOTCHERS AT FAIRS

J. N. Levine's Prize Dogs Sweep the Boards at London and Peterborough. Also Do Well at Toronto.

Mr. J. N. Levine returned last week from the South where he had his prize Scotch Collies on exhibition at the big fairs. At London, Ont., the Timmins Scotch Collies won seven firsts, heading the classes in each case for male and female. All specials in the Scotch Collie class, and "Dusky Lad," Mr. Levine's nine-month-old pup won first place for the best novice in all breeds. At Peterborough Fair there was a similar fine showing made, with another seven firsts being won, as well as all specials in the Scotch Collie class. At these two important fairs, the Levine dogs made a complete sweep.

At the Toronto Exhibition, "Dusky Lad" won four firsts and very favourable notice. At Peterborough Fair, Mr. John Massie, of Timmins, was also an important winner, being awarded two firsts for male Cocker Spaniels and two firsts for pups in this class.

Sunday, Oct. 4th, was the third anniversary of the Central Temiskaming Fire, more generally referred to as the Haileybury Fire, as the greater part of the County Town was destroyed by the flames. Haileybury has been re-built and is really a bigger and a better town to-day than before the disaster of 1922.
