**MATTAGAMI RIVER'S VALUE
TQ THE DISTRICT.**

A reader of The Advance said the other day, "The people of this town do not appreciate the value of the Mattagami River to this town and district." The answer is that neither does a man appreciate the value of an automobile if he finds that every time he wants to use it the machine has been sneaked away by his flapper daughter or the hired man.

The people of Timmins would no doubt appreciate the advantages of the river if they were more free to use it. The settlers, the prospectors, and others would also appreciate the river's value if so much time and energy had not to be expended cursing at the blocking of this same river. During several months of the year the Mattagami River is the only highway that can be used by many settlers prospectors and others. For convenience, for pleasure and for business the Mattagami River would be recognized as unusually valuable, were it not that its real value is handicapped and true appreciation clouded by the fact that passage on the river is so commonly and so unnecessarily blocked by logs. Canoeing and boating on this river too often is a danger to life, rather than a pleasure to health. Instead of being a source of convenient travel for many, the river too often is a cause of the most profane interference with the traffic on the river. Up to date the only relief the people have had from the annoyance and loss of river blocking has been the relief of cursing. It is to be hoped that some day the Department of Public Works at Ottawa will see that this navigable stream is kept open for the use of the people. When that day arrives it will be found that not only the people of Timmins, but settlers all through the district, and prospectors, and others will fully appreciate the value of this fine river.
