

Where to Vote in Timmins For the Dominion Election

List of Boundaries of the Various Polling Sub-divisions for the Town of Timmins, Together With the Place for Voting in Such Sub-Divisions.

A great many enquiries have been made as to the location of the various polling places for the Dominion Election to be held on October 29th. For the convenience of readers the list of polling places, etc., is given below. There are 26 polling sub-divisions and 14 polling places. The numbers and boundaries of the polling sub-divisions, together with the polling place, for the Town of Timmins, are as follows:—

Polling Sub-Division 62—The old Rochester Townsite. Voting at the old Municipal Building, Rochester.
Polling Sub-Divisions 63 and 64—From Fourth Avenue to Seventh and from Toke to Balsam. Voting at the Town Hall, Fourth Avenue.
Polling Sub-Division 65—St. Mary's Hospital patients, at Hospital.
Polling Sub-Divisions 66 to 67—From Fourth Avenue to Seventh Avenue and from Balsam Seventh Vimy Road. At Finnish Hall.
Polling Sub-Divisions 71 to 72—From Balsam to Mountjoy Street and from Fourth Avenue to First Avenue. At 83 Third Avenue.
Polling Sub-Divisions 73 and 74—From Spruce Street to Balsam and from First Avenue to railway spur line. At 119 Pine Street South.
Polling Sub-Division 75—From Balsam Street to Mountjoy and from First Avenue to railway spur line. At 88 First Ave.
Polling Sub-Divisions 76 to 77—From Mountjoy, West to the River and from Middleton, South to spur line. At 38 Kirby Avenue.
Polling Sub-Divisions 78, 78a and 79—From Mountjoy, West to Cameron and from Hollinger Lane, South to Middleton. At 27½ Wilson Ave.
Polling Sub-Divisions 80 and 81—All the Hollinger Townsite, from Hollinger Lane, North to boundary and from Waterloo Road to Vimy. At Hollinger Recreation Hall, Waterloo Road.
Polling Sub-Divisions 82 and 83—From Cameron Street, to west boundary of town and from Hollinger Lane to the southern boundary of the town. At 87 Wilson Avenue.
Polling Sub-Division 84—From Hollinger Lane, north to boundary and from River to Cameron. At 116 Hollinger Lane.
Polling Sub-Division 85—From Hollinger Lane, north to north boundary and from Waterloo Road to Cameron Street. At 70 Hollinger Lane.

In case of any doubt or uncertainty about where you should vote, it would be well to consult one or other of the committee rooms in town. It would be a good idea for each voter to confirm the polling place he is to use before election day.

During the winter these will be needed for the work, and the public, especially those not in touch with any of the individual organizations making up the Associated Charities, will find Mr. Dunn's office in the Town Hall a convenient centre in connection with any interest in the charity and relief work.
