

Preliminary Returns Give Ray O'Neill 537 Majority

Returns Below by Polling Places, Subject to Revision. Official Figures Will Not be Available for Several Days. Over 15,000 Votes Polled in Dominion Election in This Riding.

Below will be found the preliminary figures of the voting in this riding, North Temiskaming, at the Dominion Election, Oct. 29th, 1925. These figures are of course subject to change, but may be taken as substantially correct. The official figures by the Returning Officer for the riding will not be published for several days, as one poll (Moose Factory) will not be received for some time. There are about 80 votes at this poll. It is thought that the majority at this poll will be for Mr. Gallagher. One recent election the Moose Factory vote was solid for the Liberal candidate, Mr. Mac Lang. In the present election, however, it is expected that the two other candidates will receive some votes each.
