Basketball Association Schedules to December 11

List of Senior and Junior Games. Rules to Govern the Games. Intermediate Schedule to be Issued Shortly. Other Details Regarding Basketball in Timmins.

Last week too late for publication in the last issue The Advance was furnished with much information regarding Basketball for the season.

Basketball in Timmins is apparently away to a good start, and with capable officials in charge of the direction of the sport. Mr. F. Wolno, of the Hollinger Machine Shop, is chairman. Mr. H. Chittenden, of the Hollinger Mechanical Department is the chairman of the Senior Basketball; Mr. J. Blackshaw, of the Intermediate and Mr. Henry, of the Junior.

Senior games to start at 8.30 p.m. Games are to be played on Tuesdays and Fridays at the High School Gymnasium.

Junior games to start at 7.30 p.m. Games to be played on the same evenings as the Senior games and at the same place.

Intermediate games to start at 7.00 p.m. and 8 p.m. on Thursdays or Mondays at the Hollinger Recreation Hall.

Each Senior Basketball team shall be responsible for the promotion and regulation of a Junior Basketball team.

The following are the rules of the games:—

(1) Two twenty minute periods with 10 minutes intermission.

(2) The referee's word shall be final, and there shall be no appeal from it. A referee may be chosen from a senior team that is not playing if both teams are agreeable.

(3) All players shall be registered with the Secretary of the Association before the second round of games.

(4) Players wishing to transfer must secure consent of Executive of league.

(5) Age limit for Juniors 20 years on Dec. 31st.

NORTH BAY BRANCH OF KU KLUX KLAN ORGANIZED.

The flaming cross, the symbol of the Ku Klux Klan, was burned on the knoll across from the C.N.R. tracks at North Bay last Wednesday, signifying that the Klan has been duly organized in the baby city. The Klan claims to have 200 to 250 members at North Bay, it is stated by The Nugget. A number of the influential men of the city are members, according to the same authority, which adds that the white robes and helmets have been ordered for the members, but because of the rapid growth of the organization in Canada, it has been impossible to get the orders filled.

GEOLOGY OF THE NORTH SHORE OF LAKE HURON.

A report by Dr. W. H. Collins on the geology of the north shore of Lake Huron has been published by the Geological Survey of Canada. It presents the results of a detailed examination of the lithological, structural, and stratigraphic features of the Precambrian rocks underlying the area and of the age relations of the different systems. The section of country studied includes the type Huronian area and the report will consequently prove of intense interest to students of Precambrian geology. Descriptions are also given of the deposits of gold, copper, and other economic minerals. Copies of this report may be had on application to the Director, Geological Survey, Ottawa.

JUVENILE COURT JUDGE PAYS VISIT TO THE NORTH.

Judge Hawley S. Mott, of the Juvenile Court of Toronto, was a visitor last week to several Northern Ontario towns, including Haileybury, Cobalt and New Liskeard. At each of the places visited Judge Mott had opportunity to address public gatherings of one sort or another. At Cobalt he was a guest at luncheon of the Kiwanis Club. In his address, there was much that should set people in general thinking, and especially appeal to parents. In reference to Judge Mott's call at New Liskeard, The Speaker says:—

"Judge Hawley S. Mott, of Toronto, was the speaker at the morning service at the United Church last Sunday, and gave a most interesting address on the privileges and duties of parenthood and the home. That every child should have a fair chance to become a useful citizen, should be the aim of all training. From his wide experience as judge of the Juvenile Court in Toronto, Judge Mott was able to give telling illustrations of the failures of many homes in their duties to the children, and also of the ways in which such defects could be remedied. The need for early and faithful training in obedience and religion was especially emphasized."

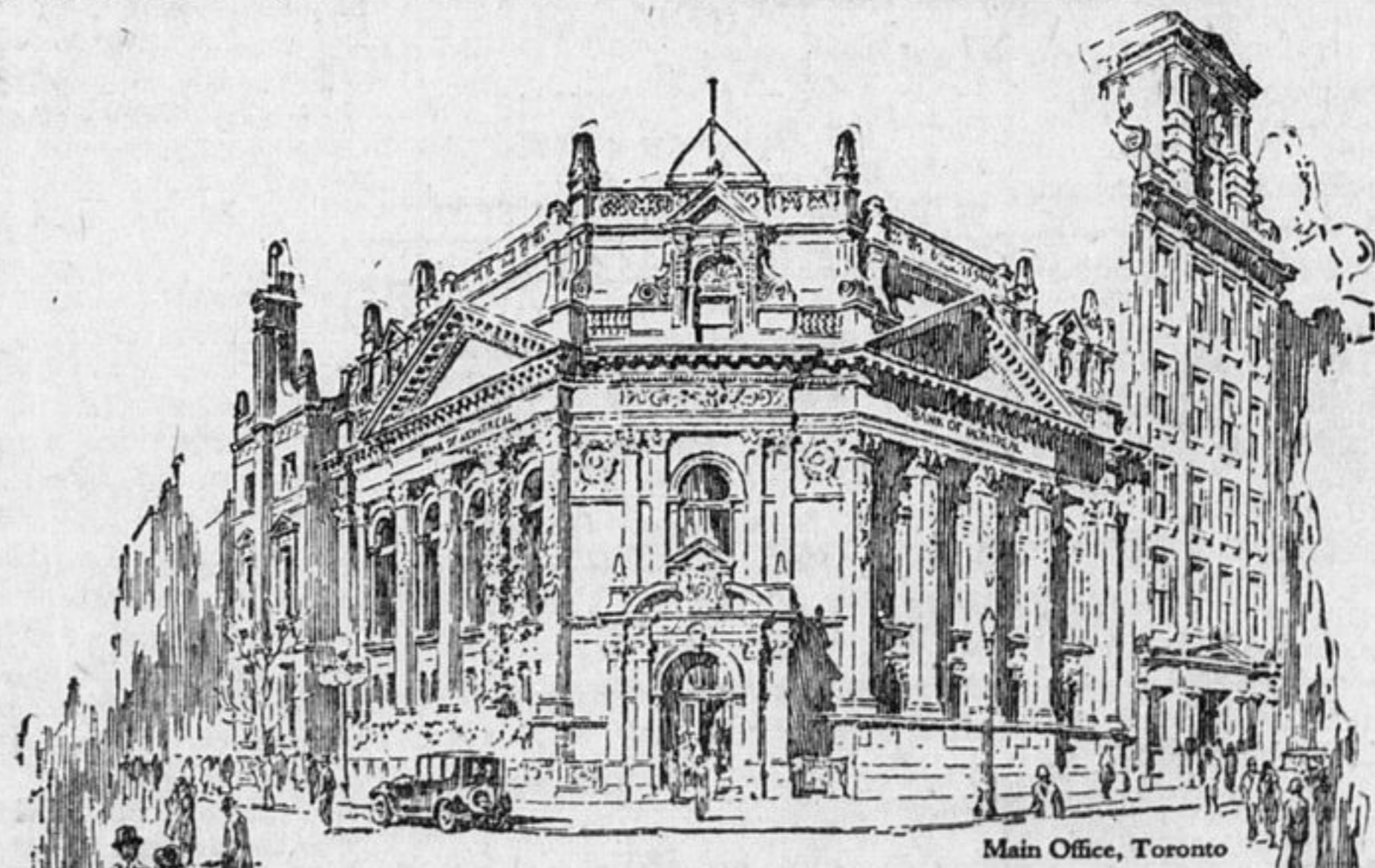
