

The judicial enquiry into the affairs issuing of a lengthy judgment in the matter by His Honour Judge Hart-793 749 765 2307 man. The enquiry was into a "supposed malfeasance or breach of trust or other misconduct" in the affairs of Bucke Township during the years follows:-

According to Judge Hartman the 7 former clerk and treasurer, Henry Ellis Gridley received \$2,800 illegally from the township in the last two months of 1924 and has misappropriate or failed to account for an additional \$1,760.39 received by him during his term of employment with the municipality. The larger sum relates to an application made by Gridley for a loan from the local Housing Commission, and which it was alleged he had obtained without anthority.
