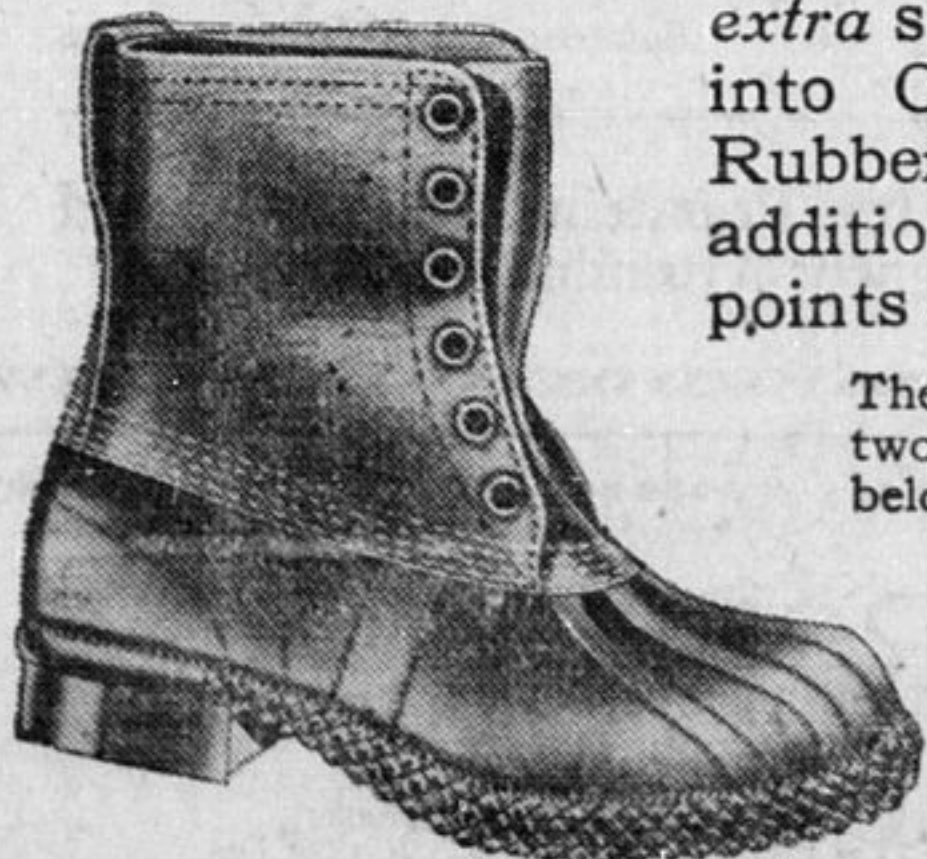

New Hospital at Iroquois Falls Credit to the North

Abitibi Power & Paper Co. Does Itself Proud in Providing the Most Modern Hospital Accommodation for the District. Wonderfully Equipped in the Most Up-to-date Way. Summary of the Hospital.

Reference is made elsewhere in this issue to the opening of the elegant new hospital at Iroquois Falls, and its wonderful equipment, the hospital being the very latest word in modern equipment and accommodation, regardless of expense. As the new hospital—the Anson General Hospital—is specifically designed not only for the benefit of the people of Iroquois Falls but for all the wide district round about, the new institution is a very decided acquisition to the whole North Land, and of special interest to all here. Accordingly, the following summary should be of more than passing concern:—

Governors and Staff.

Board of Governors—Dr. H. Maitland Young, chairman; A. J. Hodgson, \$2.50 per day; semi-private, \$3.50 per day; private, \$4.50 to \$5.00 per day. These rates are for hospital accommodation, food and nursing by the regular hospital staff. They do not include medical fees. Special nurses \$5.00 per day and \$1.50 for board.

The Board of Governors announce the following rates:—public ward, tant lady superintendent.

superintendent; Miss Whitely, assistant superintendent; Mrs. G. S. Wilson, Mrs. T. H. Wilkes, Joseph Beaudoin.

Staff—Dr. H. Maitland Young, superintendent; Miss Adams, lady secretary; T. A. McDonald, Frank Operating room charges:—for major operations, \$10.00; for minor operations, \$5.00; for confinements, \$5.00. Dressings and drugs extra in all cases.

The following is a summarized description of the new hospital at the Falls:—

Basement

Kitchen—Electric refrigerator built in and cork insulated, about 3' x 6' inside.

Electric Stove with oven heated by individual elements which are controlled separately.

Electric Steam Table with soup, meat, vegetable, gravy and pudding compartments, from which food is served to the dining rooms and onto heated food conveyors for distribution to each ward.

Laundry—A small emergency laundry for special work.

Ground Floor

Doctors' Office Suite—which corresponds to a small out-patients department, is situated in the west wing and consists of a large waiting room; consultation rooms, two examining rooms, a small treatment and surgical room, clinical laboratory and dispensary. In this suite is also located a dental operating room with the most up-to-date equipment.

Administration—Two offices are provided for the care of records and the administration of the building. These are located in the east wing.

The north wing contains patients rooms. One room with three beds, three rooms with four beds. To adequately provide for the nursing care of the patients, an appropriately placed suite of rooms consisting of a utility room, nurses work room, ward diet kitchen, and linen closet is provided. Two specially furnished private rooms with bathroom are situated on this floor.

Second Floor

Operating Suite—consists of a large operating room, specially lighted, a sterilizer room, instrument room, anaesthetic room, and obstetrical room and scrub-up rooms. A new pedestal type operating table is being installed together with most up-to-date operating room furniture.

The sterilizer room contains a battery of electric sterilizers for instruments, dressings and utensils, and sterilized water and also distilled water. A blanket warmer is also provided. Bed pan sterilizers are provided in each ward.

The instrument room contains a built-in instrument cabinet and table for setting up operating sets and cleaning instruments.

The obstetrical room is equipped with the most modern furniture and a specially designed portable operating light.

X-Ray Room—The suite consists of an X-Ray room, viewing room, record and plate filling room and dark room. There is also a room provided for special examinations and treatments.

A nursery for new born infants appropriately furnished is situated in the west wing and is equipped with an infants bath with thermostatic control.

The patients wing consists of private room and bathroom, semi-private rooms of two beds each, and a children's ward of three cots. It is served by a similar nursing suite as that provided on the ground floor.

Third Floor.

This floor provides for the accommodation of nurses and consists of eight rooms.

General Features.

Sun rooms are provided off each ward for the use of convalescent patients and those requiring its use.

An elevator large enough to accommodate a hospital bed has been installed.

Special hospital beds with adjustable frames and springs, which are

controlled mechanically are standard equipment.

Steel lockers are provided in each room for the care of patients clothing.

Inter-departmental telephones have been installed.

Nurses signal system is silent and operated by the showing of lights over the patients door and beds in the nurses work room.

NORTH NEEDS BETTER SUNDAY PHONE SERVICE

Service at Present Little Better Than Nothing. Chairman of T. & N. O. to Look Into Question

The attention of Mr. Geo. W. Lee, chairman of the T. & N. O. Railway Commission, was directed last week to the inadequate telephone service for this part of the North Land on Sundays. The T. & N. O. at Porquis Junction take all messages from or to outside points, and the hours on Sundays at present are planned for the convenience of the T. & N. O. From 10 to 12, from 3 to 5, from 8 to 10, seem to be the six short hours that long distance telephone calls are possible on Sundays. A six-hour service for this section of the North is by no means adequate for the needs. Chairmen Lee promised to investigate and see what could be done. It is to be hoped that a regular service will be inaugurated on Sundays. The telephone, like the telegraph is for emergency service, and when it is needed, it is badly needed. Timmins, Schumacher, South Porcupine, Iroquois Falls, Cochrane and other towns are concerned in this matter, and it would appear to be only fair and equitable that a proper service be inaugurated on Sundays. The T. & N. O. has the matter in its hands and all will trust that the usual T. & N. O. desire for the best possible service to the people will prevail and this important privilege for the residents of this part of the North be duly extended to limits in keeping with the requirements of the case.

ANNUAL MEETING OF LOCAL BRANCH OF CHILDREN'S AID
