
ANNUAL MEETING TIMMINS FOOTBALL CLUB, MARCH 8



CORRESPONDENTS MUST SUBMIT THEIR NAMES

Last week The Advance received a etter headed "The Facts About Cornwall," in answer to a previous communication sent to this office and published in The Advance. The letter last week was simply signed "One and All," and there was no card or name enclosed. As a consequence the letter could not be published. In common with all reputable newspapers, The Advance follows the rule that no anonymous communication is published. The writer must submit his name as an evidence of good faith. The Advance would prefer that writers come out boldly and attach their names to letters written for the newspapers. Usually there is no reason why they should not do so. Some newspapers indeed, insist on the rule that only letters actually signed with the name of the writer are accepted for publication. There are occasions when for one reason or another a writer can not sign his letter for publication, and recognizing this The Advance does not demand the real name of the writer to be attached to every published letter. This paper does, however, insist that each writer submit his or her name as an evidence of good faith and so that The Advance | may know the source of the communieation. The name need not be published, if requested otherwise, but the real name must accompany the communication. No reputable newspaper will accept any anonymous letter for publication. On several recent occasions The Advance has pointed out 2 these facts. Whether The Advance agrees or disagrees with the communication, no letter will be published when the origin is not know. If you wish to have something published in The Advance send your name along. If you do not wish your name printed, simply say so; The Advance will respect the confidence.
