Revised Rules for Ontario Football Cup Competition

Several Changes That Will be of Special Interest to Timmings and District Football Fans. Date for Naming Winner of District Qualifying Competition Set to Second Saturday in June. This will do away with one of the Chief Handicaps of Past Years.

The many football enthusiasts in Timmings will find the following review of the rules and regulations of the Ontario Football Cup of special interest. There will be particular interest in the clause requiring all district qualifying competitions to be settled by the second Saturday in June. This does away with the hold-up at the end of the season, which has spoiled the competition each year for several years past.

The following are the "Ontario Cup" rules as now laid down by the O.F.A. executive:—

1. The Cup shall be called the "Ontario Cup."

2. The Cup shall be the property of the Ontario Football Association, and shall be held in trust by the Council.

3. The entire control and management of this Competition shall be vested in the Council, subject to the provision of Rule No. 5.

4. The Competition shall be open to all Clubs in membership with District Associations in good standing with the Ontario Football Association.

5. The Ontario Football Association delegates to each District Association in good standing, full power to conduct and control a qualifying Competition for this Cup, and the receipts of the District Final shall be divided as follows: 1-3 to each competing Club and to the District Association concerned.

6. The entrance fee for this Competition shall be \$20.00.

7. Each eligible Club desirous of competing in this Competition shall give notice to the secretary of the District Association in which it holds membership, on or before the date fixed by the District Association concerned, and the fee of \$20.00 must accompany such entry. The Secretary of the District Association shall forward to the Secretary of the Ontario Football Association the sum of \$15.00 for each such entry.

8. Each District Association must send the name of the winner of their qualifying Competition to the Secretary of the Ontario Football Association not later than the 2nd Saturday of June; otherwise they will be debarred from taking any further part in the Competition.

9. For the purpose of this Competition, a playing member of a Club is one who has signed the Registration Form of the Dominion of Canada Association, and been registered with the Ontario Football Association in accordance with its Rules and Regulations.

10. No player shall be allowed to play for than one Club in this Competition, or any qualifying series in this connection.

11. In the event of a doubt as to the qualifications of any player the District Association in which his Club is a member shall have power to decide his eligibility or otherwise. An appeal against any such decision must be lodged with the Secretary of the Ontario Football Association within three days of such decision.

12. All appointed Referees shall be paid the sum of \$5.00 per game in this Competition, in addition to any actual travelling and hotel expenses where necessary.

13. The gate receipts of all matches in this Competition shall be divided as follows: 1st.—Ground Hire, if any 2nd.—Referee's Fees. 3rd.—13 actual railway fares to the visiting Club, where necessary. 4th.—Advertising. 5th.—5% to the Dominion of Canada Football Association.

14. These expenses shall be defrayed from the receipts according to this list, and the balance of receipts, if any, shall be divided equally between the contending Clubs, except in the Semi-Final and Final Game. N.B. Should the receipts from any game be insufficient to cover the total expense involved, the Home Club shall be responsible only to the extent of the Receipts, after which the Visiting Club shall be responsible for all expense incurred by their Officers or Representatives.

15. In the event of a Protest in this Competition a fee of \$50.00 must be deposited with the Secretary of the Ontario Football Association prior to such protest being considered; and such fee shall be either forfeited or returned as the Council of Protest Committee shall determine.

16. In the event of a Protest in the District Competition a fee of \$25.00 must be deposited with the Secretary of the District Association concerned prior to such protest being considered; and such fee shall be either forfeited or returned as the District Association determines.

17. The Semi-Finals and Final Games in this Competition will be conducted by the Ontario Football Association, which shall take all receipts therefrom, and defray thereout, all expenses which in the opinion of the Ontario Football Association Council are necessary and proper according to and covered by these Rules.

18. On the Provincial Winner being declared, the Secretary-Treasurer of the Ontario Football Association shall prepare a Statement of all Receipts and Expenses and the balance shown shall be divided as follows: 1-3 to the Association, and the remainder divided pro rata among the Clubs concerned.

19. Players transferred shall not be eligible to take part in this Competition until fourteen days shall have elapsed from the date of transfer. This applies to all qualifying competitions.

N.B. All Clubs competing in this Competition must comply with the Financial Regulations contained in Rule 18 of the Amateur Challenge Cup Competition of the Dominion of Canada Football Association Rules. Ontario Football Association Plenty Cup Competition.

1. This Competition shall be called the "Ontario Plenty Cup Competition."

2. This Competition shall be open to all Clubs nominated by all District Associations desiring to compete.

3. This Competition shall be conducted in accordance with the Rules of the Ontario Series for the Dominion Championship Challenge Cup.

4. All entries for this Competition must be in the hands of the Secretary of the Ontario Football Association by the 15th day of August in each year, accompanied by a fee of \$5.00 for each competing Club.

Of this amount, \$144,400 had been subscribed in stock, of which the sum of \$108,000 had already been paid, and the balance will be secured by a mortgage on the property, in accordance with a by-law passed by the board of directors and ratified and confirmed by the shareholders at the meeting on Monday."
