**ARGONAUT DEVELOPMENT MAKES GOOD PROGRESS**

The following despatch is from the last issue of The Toronto Mail & Empire:—  
"That a high rate of speed is being maintained in the lateral development along the 1,000-foot level of the Argonaut Mine is attested by official information received yesterday that already 80 feet has been opened up in the crosscut with the objective of downward extension of the high grade vein system of the 750-foot level brought much closer—less than 200 feet to go. As the mineralization is very much heavier along this low level than was the case above, Mine Manager Thomas and General Manager J. A. Naud are both confident new veins will be encountered as this work continues and before the objective is reached.  
"Breaking down from 8 to 10 feet a day on both the 875 and 1,000-foot levels indicates that it will only require a comparatively short time before these low horizons may be expected to be in ore and incidentally augment the mine reserves to an appreciable degree. The new gold-copper vein which came into the main

shaft at a depth of 970 feet, assumes large proportions on the 1,000-foot level and is confidently expected to eventually prove a valuable source of ore supply for the future.  
"Development work along the 625-foot level to open up the new ore-body uncovered at the time deepening of the shaft was started from this depth will be resumed within the next few days and the possibilities contained therein are adjudged most favorable inasmuch as "pay" ore was brought into sight in the limited amount of development done.  
"Milling operations are continuing to give satisfactory results so that April production of gold is likely to be quite substantial, the plant handling 100 tons daily and mill heads reported averaging higher than in recent months."

**P.D.F.L. TRANSFER DATE CHANGED TO JULY 1st**

After That Date Players Can Not Transfer. Referees for all P.D.F.L. Matches to be Selected

At the meeting of the P.D.F.L. on Monday evening of this week there were many matters of interest discussed. Mr. Ted Duxfield occupied the chair and carried the business along effectively.

It was decided that referees for all P.D.F.L. matches be selected, the committee for this being Messrs. J. Stewart, J. Moore and the secretary, F. J. Hornby. The fee for referees is to be \$2.00 and expenses.

The annual meeting of the P.D.F.L. is to be held each year on the last Saturday in March.

Mr. Everest addressed the meeting in regard to rugby football. He enquired as to dates that might be open for any matches here for the rugby enthusiasts. He was referred to the secretary for the necessary information after the schedule was announced.

After discussion the matter of drawing up a schedule for the P.D.F.L. for the season's games was left in the hands of the President and the Secretary.

Mr. Duxfield, the president, spoke of the interest felt in junior football. He thought there would surely be a team in Schumacher this season and work was being done now to get one at the Dome. This would mean good games for the juniors and a successful season. He thought that perhaps the League could encourage the boys by putting up medals or some such way. Mr. Jardine was also strongly in favour of helping along junior football, but financial reasons required careful consideration before any commitments were made. The question was laid over to another meeting.

This season the Dome is to have only one team, the other team being withdrawn. The Dome team's colours will be Black and Amber.

A change was made in the transfer rule. The new rule is that no transfer can be made after July 1st.

**MEETING TO ARRANGE FOR BIG MATCH THIS SEASON**

Various Bodies Co-operating With Football Club in Arrangements for Visit of Touring English Team.

The Timmins Football Executive has called a general committee meeting of representatives of the Town Council, the Board of Trade, the Kiwanis, the Timmins Citizens' Band, all the Mines in the district, and other representative bodies, the plan being to secure general interest and co-operation in the arrangements for the visit here of the touring English F.A. team on July 7th. The meeting is called for Friday evening of this week, April 30th, in the council chamber, at 7:30 p.m. The Mayor and the heads of various other bodies and organizations have been specially invited. It is hoped at this meeting to get interest fully aroused and also to lay plans for the fitting entertainment of the visiting team. It is recognized that the visit of the touring English F. A. team to Timmins is the greatest event in the history of football in this North. It is one of the most outstanding incidents in the history of North Country sport. From a general viewpoint it is of special importance. Accordingly, it is desired that Timmins should do its full part in the matter and make the most of the occasion. To this end the co-operation

and assistance of all is sought, and the meeting Friday evening at 7 p.m. in the council chamber is designed to get the arrangements under way with a swing.

**OPENING FOOTBALL MATCH SATURDAY AFTERNOON**

Hollinger Winners of Last Year's League, to Play Picked Team. Kick-off at 6 p.m.

The first football match for this season is scheduled for Saturday afternoon of this week, May 1st. Kick-off at 6 p.m. sharp.
