Earl Lawson, acting under authority from the Department of Health, has appointed a sanitary committee to promulgate and enforce sanitary regulations governing those resident here or going into the mining camps further north.

Pine Ridge is the centre of activity for all the mining camps of the District of Patricia, and since the Recording Office was located there on June 10, there has been a considerable influx of prospectors.
