**MUNICIPAL ELECTIONS  
DEFERRED TO JANUARY**

Council Rescinds By-law for December Date. Voters' Lists Now Being Prepared.

There was a special meeting of the town council on Thursday last, and several interesting matters were dealt with.

By-law No. 325 to close grocery and meat shops every Wednesday in the year, except the month of December, was given its required readings and duly passed.

The by-law repealing the one setting the date of municipal elections was also duly passed. According to this new by-law, No. 324, the municipal elections this year will be held on the first Monday in January, the nominations to be on the last Monday in December.

The Power Co. was requested to install twelve 200-watt lights on Spruce street and Pine street from Second to Fourth Avenue and from Spruce st. to Birch street on Third Avenue, the old lights to be installed in other

parts of the town as previously ordered.

Moved by Councillors Brennan and Eplett, and carried, that the clerk be instructed to proceed with and complete the voters' list for 1926, and that Monro M. Gibson be appointed to assist him.

The engineer's department was instructed to place service taps at the corner of Mountjoy and Columbus, and Mountjoy and Maple streets.

**S. A. CALDBICK APPOINTED  
DISTRICT CROWN ATTORNEY**

Popular Timmins Barrister Receives Appointment to Succeed Mr. J. M. Greer.

Last week word was received in Timmins that Mr. S. A. Caldbeck, of Timmins, had been appointed Crown Attorney for the District of Cochrane, to succeed Mr. J. M. Greer, of Cochrane, who resigned some time ago to devote all his time and attention to private practice. Throughout the district the appointment of Mr. Caldbeck appears to be very popular. One barrister this week said:—"He will be a worthy successor to John M. Greer. He has the big requirement for a good crown attorney; you can always depend on him being absolutely straight and fair and honest; also he has a wide law reading and more than usual talent."

It is understood that Mr. Caldbeck will continue to reside in Timmins. He will take over his new duties as crown attorney for the district at once.

Mr. Caldbeck has been in Timmins for over five years, and has worked up a good practice here. He is a son of Sheriff Geo. Caldbeck, of Haileybury.

**THREATS MADE AGAINST  
COCHRANE OFFICIALS**

Letter from Toronto Suggests "There are Two More to Follow" Fate of Inspector Constable.

Cochrane and Provincial police have further work in connection with the dastardly murder of Inspector Constable. The latest feature is the threatening of other officials. Every effort should be made to get to the bottom of this. If it has connection with the murder of Inspector Constable, it should be disclosed. It is simply the work of some criminal fool, it should be severely dealt with as a warning against threats and interfering with the course of justice and criminal investigation. Despatches from Cochrane this week make special reference to this feature—the threatening of other officials.

Following a series of rumors that further attempts would be made to intimidate the police as a result of the furore caused by the murder of License Inspector Constable, a letter of warning was received on Wednesday of last week by Chief of Police Parsons of Cochrane, warning him that "two more are to follow," and that "a word to the wise should be sufficient."

The letter was printed on plain white paper, in plain characters. The envelope was post marked Toronto, October 19th, 1926, and was addressed to "The Chief of Police, Cochrane, Ontario." The letter ran as follows: "Take warning. "One spotter has been bumped off. There are two more to follow." A word to the wise should be sufficient. "O. T. A. The police are investigating the letter and other clues regarding the murder of Inspector Constable.

**NOTICE THAT BACK TAXES  
ARE TO BE COLLECTED NOW**

As will be seen by the notice elsewhere in this issue, the Municipality of Timmins gives warning that all taxes due the town must be paid on or before November 10th, or they will be handed in for collection. **Notice of Sittings of the Revising Officer**

TAKE NOTICE, that Sittings of the Revising Officer for the purpose of hearing complaints or appeals with regard to the Voters' Lists to be used at the Election of a Member of the Assembly pending for the Electoral District of South Cochrane, will be held at the following times and places, namely:—
