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### MORE MONEY TO BE ASKED FOR DEVELOPING NORTH

Associated Boards of Trade to Consider Question of Indigents from Unorganized Territory, and Other Problems

In addition to the important matter of the election of officers for the ensuing year, the Northern Ontario Associated Boards of Trade at the meeting to be held in Cochrane tomorrow (Friday) will have many interesting questions of value to the North Land to consider. It is hoped that there will be a large attendance from all parts of the district, and especially from the larger and more important centres like Timmins, South Porcupine, Schumacher, Iroquois Falls, New Liskeard, Haileybury, Cobalt, Englehart, Matheson and Cochrane.

Among the matters covered by resolutions understood to be sent in to the Associated Boards for discussion at the meeting to-morrow (Friday) are the following of special interest and importance in this North: More money for development of the North, especially in the matter of expenditures for needed roads.

The securing of legislation or some arrangement whereby the Government will assume the place of the municipality in reference to indigents from unorganized territory.

The unfairness of Crown property, such as Government railway and other public utility property, being exempt from municipal taxation.

The matter of the completion of the T. & N.O. to tidewater.

The relief of the North from the gasoline tax, in view of the fact that the Highway Department, now directly profiting by this tax, does not spend any money on North Land roads, these being under the jurisdiction of the Northern Development Dept.

The aid by the Government in the work of testing out the coal fields north of Cochrane.

All who can attend the annual meeting of the Associated Boards of Trade at Cochrane on Friday of this week, Nov. 12th, should make a point of being present.

In addition to the business of the meeting, the delegates will be the guests of the Cochrane Boards of Trade in the evening.

  2. Additional lamps to be installed on the instructions of the Municipality.
  3. Ornamental lamps, such as are already installed at the corners of Pine Street and Third Avenue to be installed where called for by the Municipality.

A despatch from Rouyn says:—

Considerable cash had to be paid over very shortly under the terms of the deal, and results apparently did not warrant this. Some success has marked exploration work to date. Winter quarters are now being put up on the Montbray property, and some dipneedle work may be done this winter."
