

This huge bell, known as "The Founder's," is here shown in New York I harbor, being lowered over the side of the Cunard liner Ascania, wellknown on the St. Lawrence Route. The bell weighs over 17 tons, is 9 1/2 feet in diameter at the rim, and is 7'9" high. It was cast in Croydon, England, and shipped to Philadelphia, where it now hangs in a specially constructed tower on top of a department store. The bell strikes a low "D", and can be heard for a distance of 30 miles.
