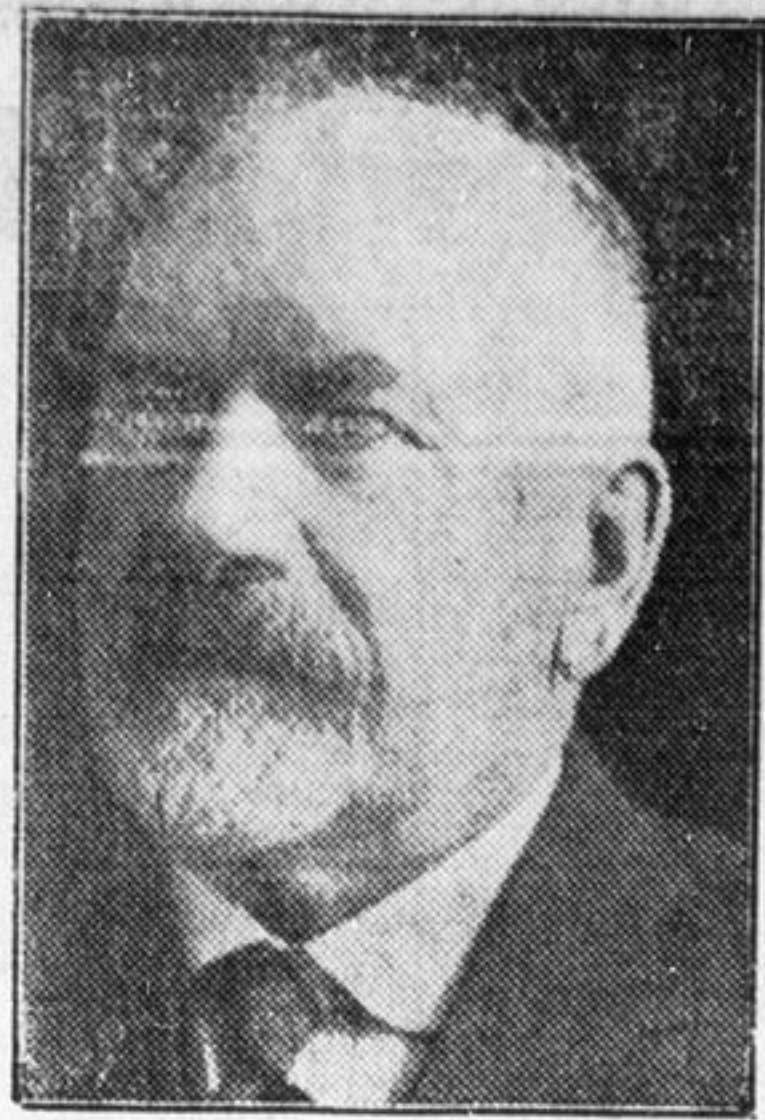

DATES OF DEPARTMENTAL EXAMINATIONS THIS YEAR

Schedule for High School Entrance, Lower School, Middle School and Upper School Examinations.

The following are the dates for the departmental examinations this year:

High School Entrance examinations, Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday, June 28th, 29th and 30th. The subjects for Tuesday are grammar, writing and history; for Wednesday, composition, spelling and literature; and for Thursday, arithmetic and geography.

English-French Model Entrance examinations are on the same dates as the High School Entrance, June 28th, 29th and 30th. The subjects are: Tuesday, composition, spelling and geography; Wednesday, grammar and French grammar; Thursday, arithmetic and French composition.

The Lower School examinations are to be on Friday, Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, June 24th, 27th, 28th, 29th and 30th. The subjects are as follows:—Friday, June 24th, agriculture; Monday, June 27th, physiography, grammar, Latin grammar; Tuesday, history, geography; Wednesday, art, botany; Thursday, arithmetic, zoology.

Middle School examinations commence on Monday, June 20th, and continue to Tuesday, July 5th, Saturdays and Sundays not included. The subjects for each day are:—Monday, June 20th, literature, chemistry; Tuesday, June 21st, geometry, British history; Wednesday, physics, composition; Thursday, algebra, ancient history, music; Friday, French authors, French composition; Monday, June 27th, Latin authors, Latin composition;

Tuesday, agriculture; Wednesday, German authors, German composition; Thursday, arithmetic; Monday, July 4th, Greek authors, Greek accidence; Tuesday, July 5th, Spanish authors, Spanish composition.

The Upper School examinations will be on the same dates as for the Middle School. The following are the subjects for each day:—Monday, June 20th, literature, chemistry; Tuesday, June 21st, geometry, history; Wednesday, June 22nd, problems, composition; Thursday, June 23rd, algebra; Friday, June 24th, French authors and French composition; Monday, June 27th, Latin authors, Latin composition; Tuesday, June 28th, trigonometry, botany; Wednesday, June 29th, German authors, German composition; Thursday, June 30th, physics, zoology; Monday, July 4th, Greek authors, Greek composition; Tuesday, July 5th, Spanish authors, Spanish composition.
