VALUES OF FARM LANDS

Ottawa, Canada.—According to a recent compilation made by the Canadian Government Bureau of Statistics the average value of the occupied farm lands of Canada as a whole, including both improved and unimproved land, as well as dwelling houses, barns, stables and other farm buildings is returned as \$37 per acre, as compared with \$38 in 1925 and with \$37 in each of the two years. By provinces the averages are as follows:—Prince Edward Island, \$46; Nova Scotia, \$36; New Brunswick, \$31; Quebec, \$53; Ontario, \$62; Manitoba, \$29; Saskatchewan, \$25; Alberta, \$26; British Columbia, \$80. The average values in 1926 of orchard and fruit lands, including buildings, etc., in the fruit-growing districts are estimated to be as follows: Nova Scotia, \$129; Ontario, \$124; British Columbia, \$320.

EIGHT DRUG STORES HERE FINED ON LIQUOR CHARGES

Just before press time to-day eight drug stores in town faced charges under the Ontario Temperance Act. They were charged with illegally having liquor. Those charged were:—Gray's Drug Store, Timmins Drug Co., MacDonell's Drug, Sauve Pharmacy, Burke's, Gordon's, Goldfields Drug, and Emery's Drug Store. Each and all pleaded guilty and were fined \$500.00 and costs each. Another case disposed of was that of a charge against Farley's hospital, where liquor had been supplied to patients being treated, without the formality of a prescription. A fine of \$500.00 and costs was imposed in this case also. The information for this case was laid by Provincial Officer Finger.
