Liquor Permits Under New Act on Sale Here Wednesday

Mr. T. H. Torrance, Reed Block, Issuer of Permits for Timmins. Forms Cost \$2.00 Each. Five Hundred of the Forms Ready Here This Week at Same Time as They Went on Sale at Toronto.

Under the Liquor Control Act of Ontario, permits for the purchase of liquor were ready at Timmins on Wednesday morning,—the same time that they were available at Toronto and other large centres. Mr. T. H. Torrance, Reed block, Timmins, has been appointed issuer of permits for this area, and the forms for same may be secured from him. The charge for the permit is \$2.00. Only 500 of the forms were received here this week, but more no doubt will be available at a very early date. As the forms are not transferrable, it is likely that a much greater number than 500 will be required here, as every man will want to have one of his own.

The permits are printed on tough, heavy paper, but as they will be in use a comparatively long time, holders will do well to secure strong covers for same so as to stand handling. On the back of the permit there are 52 spaces for entering purchases. Each purchase of liquor must be endorsed on the permit by the vendor. The back of the permit is ruled off to show date, quantity, kind of liquor, and vendor's initials.

The following is the form of the permit:—

This is to certify that the above named applicant, whose signature is hereto attached is entitled to purchase liquor in accordance with the provisions of the Liquor Control Act of Ontario and the Regulations made thereunder. This permit can not be used by any person other than the above named applicant.

The permits are being taken up quite rapidly.

Until the establishment of a liquor store in Timmins, purchases must be made from the North Bay store, and a permit is necessary before the purchase can be made.

AMALGAMATION OF BIG INTERESTS IN ROUVY CAMP

Noranda Reported as Securing Control of Waite-Montgomery and Alderson-McKay.

A despatch this week from Montreal reads as follows:—

What is regarded by mining men as perhaps the most important development to date in the Quebec mining field is the announcement that an arrangement has been reached by Noranda Mines, Limited and N. A. Timmins, whereby Noranda acquires Mr. Timmins' interest in the Waite-Montgomery and Alderson-McKay properties. By this transaction, Noranda secures an 81 per cent. interest in the Waite-Montgomery property and approximately 70 per cent. in the Alderson-McKay Mine. Mr. Timmins completes the respective option payments on each property and receives for his interests treasury shares of Noranda Mines, Limited.

Negotiations on this deal have been going on over a considerable period, and many rumours have sprung up as to the situation. Lacking knowledge of just what was going on, it is only natural that some of these rumours should have been a bit wild. What has happened is of great importance to Noranda and to the Rouvyn Camp in general. It really means that Mr. Timmins is taking Noranda shares for his interests in the other properties, and by this means, in effect merging his holdings in the camp.

The deal gives Noranda additional large bodies of high-grade ore immediately available for their smelters. It also assures the rapid development of both properties and the consequent benefit to Noranda. Mr. Timmins was already a very heavy holder of Noranda stock and his acquisition of these additional blocks make him the dominating figure of the Quebec mining field. The step is a constructive one from all points of view and should meet with general approval.

Indications at the present time are that Towagmac Exploration Company

will continue to hold its interest in the Alderson-McKay Mine. This will make little difference in the situation, although at various times it has been rumoured that Towagmac might swing into the deal also. Reports in the past two weeks, supplemented by discoveries on the Alderson-McKay property, indicate that this mine is developing into one of major importance, which makes the situation interesting for both Noranda and Towagmac.

LIBERALS AGAIN SWEEP THE PROVINCE OF QUEBEC

The Liberal party in the province of Quebec, under the leadership of Premier L. A. Taschereau, went back into power in the provincial elections on Monday. Hon. Mr. Taschereau and party have a larger majority than before. The returns show 72 Liberals, 2 Independent Liberals and only 10 Conservatives. The city of Montreal even went back on the Conservative party in the province. Monday the Liberals got seven seats in Montreal where at the previous election they had only two. On odd feature of the election was the election of Aime Guertin, Conservative candidate for Hull. This is the first time in thirty years that a Conservative candidate has represented Hull. Quebec province has had a Liberal party in power now for 30 years. As one newspaper puts it:—Liberals in Quebec province have been voting for Hon. Mr. Taschereau because he is called a Liberal; Conservatives have been voting for him because he is safe and sane and

IMPORTANT DEVELOPMENTS AT THE BENNETT MINES

A report just issued by Bennett Mining Co., whose property is 17 miles east of Dane on Monocle lake and not far from the Argonaut, says that important developments have recently taken place at the property. The report says:—

"The cross-cut running to the south of our shaft at the 500-foot level, at approximately 550 feet, is in very highly mineralized formation, and is apparently entering the series of seven veins mentioned in previous report, which have shown such sensational values at surface," says the statement.

"Samples from these veins on surface with no free gold showing gave on assay, values up to \$5,000 to the ton in gold. This is telluride ore which is recognized as being very deep seated and consistent at depth. The cross-cut running to the north-west has been completed to a distance of approximately 570 feet, and is also entering a heavy mineralized zone.

"We have secured the services of J. C. Houston, E.M., as consulting engineer. Mr. Houston was at one time manager of the Dome Mines, and had complete charge, and also constructed the mill at the Schumacher and the Lake Shore Mine."

Mr. Houston is to be assisted by J. M. C. Dunlop, E.M., who will act as resident engineer.

A payment of \$10,000 was made this week upon the purchase of the Parent property, and ample funds are said to be on hand and being accumulated to carry on the development of this property into production with a 200-ton mill.
